FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST.

In pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, His Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 18th day of October, 1909, and coming into operation on the 18th day of October, 1909, has been made on his representation by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, relating to the rates of postage on outgoings parcels addressed to Rhodesia.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN  
ENGLAND.

(Dated October 22nd, 1909.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts :—

1. And whereas it is expedient in order that the Sub-Districts of Blything Registration District should be made co-extensive with the respective Relief Districts of Blything Union as recently

re-arranged, that the Registration District should be re-divided into two Sub-Districts to be constituted as follows : (a) a Sub-District to be called and known as Leiston Sub-District and to consist of Aldringham with Thorpe, Bramfield, Chediston, Cookley, Gratfield, Darsham, Dunwich, Heveingham, Huutingfield, Kelsale, Knoddishall, Leiston, Linstead Magna, Linstead Parva, Middleton, Peasenhall, Sibton, Theberton, Ubbeston, Walpole, Westleton, and Yoxford Civil Parishes; and (b) a Sub-District to be called and known as Southwold Sub-District and to consist of Benacre, Blyford, Blythburgh, Brampton, Covehithe, Easton Bavents, Frostenden, Halesworth, Henham, Henstead, Holton, Reydon, Rumburgh, Sotherton, South Cove, Southwold, Spexhall, Stoven, Thorington, Uggeshall, Walberswick, Wangford, Wenhaston, Westhall, Wissett and Wrentham.

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on 1st day of November, nineteen hundred and nine.
