The following Addresses were presented to The King on Monday, the 25th October, on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Norwich for the purpose of presenting colours to the units of the Territorial Force in Norfolk, and of laying the foundation stone of the new buildings to be added to the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital:-

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty:-May it please Your Majesty.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the ancient city of Norwich and county of the same city, desire to offer Your Majesty a sincere welcome on the occasion of Your Majesty's first visit as King to this city. It is 238 years since a King of England has so favoured us.

It may interest Your Majesty, who has honoured the county of Norfolk by making it Your Majesty's home, to learn that it has been recently discovered that Your Majesty's Royal predecessors, King Henry III, King Edward I and King Edward II had a residence and park at Burgh by Ayshah, and frequently visited them for hunting and shooting.

We recall with the pleasantest recollection Your Majesty's several previous visits when Prince of Wales, and the interest Your Majesty has repeatedly shown in this city and its charitable institutions.

We offer Your Majesty our hearty thanks for

Units of the Territorial Forces, in whom Your Majesty has shown so keen an interest, and of laying the foundation stone of the extensions to the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital, the foundation stone of the present hospital having been laid by Your Majesty in the year 1879.

We further beg to assure Your Majesty of the regard and respect in which Your Majesty and Your Royal Consort are held in a city inhabited by the descendants of so many of Her Majesty's Scandinavian countrymen.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:-

"I heartily thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address of Welcome.

"You are all aware of My constant interest in the welfare of the county of Norfolk, and it gives Me the greatest pleasure to visit the capital city of the county.

"Norwich has been an important centre of the life of the country from very early times; it has been the scene of warlike incidents, and it has always been renowned for the industries pursued by its citizens. Your splendid cathedral, your numerous churches, your fine memorials testify to the piety and public spirit of your ancestors; and the numerous important factories which you have established give testimony of your activity and show that your skill and energy, though turned into different channels, have in no way diminished.

May it please Your Majesty,

When You honoured us by laying the foundation stone of this Hospital in 1879, it fell to the lot of my late father to present Your Majesty with an Address. And now-thirty years later having succeeded my father as President of the Hospital, it is the privilege of my office to be allowed to welcome Your Majesty this afternoon, and to thank You in the name of the Governors and all friends of the Hospital for the sincere interest which You have always taken in the welfare of this Institution.

It is within our grateful recollection that Your Majesty, accompanied by Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Alexandra, paid a second visit to this Hospital in 1884, when the present building was completed, and it is a source of singular gratification to the Governors that Your Majesty has been willing to pay us a third visit to-day to inaugurate a further effort on our part to extend the usefulness of the Hospital, and to bring within reach of the poorest citizen the latest results of medical and surgical research.

The building, of which Your Majesty has graciously consented to lay the foundation stone, is intended for those persons whose presence in the ordinary wards of the Hospital would be a source of danger to their fellow-patients. when this building is finished, if, as we hope and believe, the liberality of the City and County, stimulated by the sympathy of their King, will furnish us with adequate resources, other and much-needed improvements will follow.

It will, I trust, be of interest to Your Majesty to know that the Hospital Authorities have given every encouragement to their Nurses to join the Nursing Service of the Territorial Force of the East Anglian Division. In addition to this, we have undertaken to supply Nurses for special service under the Admiralty, should necessity arise.

May I add in conclusion, that it is the fervent prayer of everyone connected with this Institution that Your Majesty may be a witness, for long years to come, of the growing popularity and the increasing efficiency of the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order: Daily Visitation of Sick and Lying-in Wards of Workhouse: Transferring certain Duties from Master and Matron to Superintendent Nurse:—

WORCESTER UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Worcester Union;—

And to all others whom it may conceru.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouses of certain Unions, including the Worcester Union, and the duties of persons appointed to certain offices in the said Workhouses, including the offices of Master and Matron of the Workhouse;

And whereas by Articles 208 and 210 of the said Order the Master and Matron of the Workhouse are respectively required to visit the wards of the male and female paupers every morning and night, and to see that the regulations prescribed in the said Articles are duly and properly carried out;

And whereas it is expedient that other provision should be made as regards the visitation of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse of the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that the following Regulations shall be in force in the said Worcester Union as regards the visitation of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse of the Union:—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the Superintendent Nurse to visit each of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse daily and to see that the said wards have been duly cleansed and are properly warmed and ventilated, and also that all such arrangements are made as may be necessary for the proper care of and attendance upon the inmates both by day and during the night.

ARTICLE II.—The duty of making morning and nightly visits to the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse shall cease to be part of the duties of the Master or Matron of the Workhouse, as the case may be; but, except to this extent, nothing in this Order shall affect the duties of the Master or Matron so far as those

duties relate to the general control of the Workhouse.

TEMPORARY ORDER of the Local Government Board: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families:—

WANDSWORTH UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Wandsworth and Clapham Union (now known as the Wandsworth Union), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

Article I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Wandsworth Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

Article II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during

the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any ablebodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

- (2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.
- (3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contra-vention of subdivision (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

Article III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 29TH OCTOBER 1909.)

SUFFOLK (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1909.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the

following provisions shall apply-

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):-

Section forty-three (Police);

Section forty-four (General Administrative

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Suffolk (Control of Dogs) Order of 1909.
