(2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is a Sectiou comprised in Part V, or is one of the Sections by sub-division (1) of this Ar icle described as comprised in Part II, Part III, or Part IV, and declared to be in force, the Section, in any contributory place in which it is by sub-division (1) of this Article declared to be in force, shall be in force subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say:

Unless and until We, by a further Order made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify, and direct, the said section, in its application to the contributory place, and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties . of the local authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

PART II.

Section twenty-five. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twentythree of the Public Health Amendment Act, Acts 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling - houses, shall cease to be exercisable."

Section twentyseven.

"(7) Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."

PART III. Section thirty-five.

"This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875.

"Bye-laws made in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not, in relation to any subject - matter of this section, be of any force or effect in any contributory place within the district."

Section thirtyeight.

"Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attach ing to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890,"

PART IV.

٠.٠. Section fifty-nine. "(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not in any contributory place within the district."

PART V. Section seventyfive.

"(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the local authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT; 1907.

OTICE is hereby given, that an Order in the terms hereunder given has been issued by the Home Office, declaring certain sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force in the urban district of East Barnet Valley, subject to the modifications specified in such Order.

The Order is as follows:-

"Secretary of State, "Home Department.

"In pursuance of the power conferred on me by section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, I hereby declare sec-tion 81 (extending definition of public place and street for certain purposes) modified by the omission of all the words after 'the following offences,' except the words 'every person who wilfully and indecently exposes his person, section 85 (Registries for servants), and section 86 (As to dealers in old metal and marine stores) of Part VII, Part VIII (Fire brigade) and Part IX (Sky signs) of the said Act to be in force in the urban district of East Barnet Valley.

"And I direct that the Urban District Council shall, within three weeks from this date, cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette and in one or more newspapers circulating in the district.
