

To empower the Company to make and recover rates, rents and charges for the supply of gas and for electricity and the hire of meters and fittings, and to make all necessary provisions for the recovery of such rates, rents and charges.

To make special provisions with respect to the charges for gas or electricity supplied through a prepayment meter and the sums to be charged for the hire of such meters and the fittings connected or to be used therewith.

To enable the Company to make regulations with respect to and specify the position, size and material of pipes and fittings to be laid on the consumers' premises, the position of meters in buildings and the inspection of meters, pipes, engines and fittings accordingly, to make provision for enforcing such regulations by penalty or otherwise, and to prevent the use of pipes or fittings which do not comply with the Company's specification, and to enable the Company to cut off or refuse to supply gas or electricity through any pipes or fittings which are defective or insufficient or do not comply with such specification.

To confer all such further and other powers as may be deemed necessary or expedient for effecting the purposes aforesaid or any of them, and to vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the purposes of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

To incorporate with the intended Act and extend and apply as well to the mains, pipes and works of the Limited Company laid down or constructed before the passing of the Act, as to all mains, pipes, cables, wires and works which may be laid down or constructed under the powers of the intended Act, all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871; the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888; the Electric Lighting Clauses Act, 1899; the Companies Clauses Acts, and so far as they may be necessary or expedient to alter, amend or extend all or some of the provisions of those Acts, and to repeal, alter or amend the Havant Gas Order, 1879.

Duplicate plans and sections showing the lands and other property proposed to be acquired by compulsion for the purposes thereof or under the powers of the Bill with a book of reference to such plans containing the names of the owners or reputed owners, lessees or reputed lessees, and of the occupiers of such lands or other property and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will on or before the 30th day of November instant be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Southampton at his office at Winchester, and also with the Clerk to the Urban District Council of Havant at his office at Havant.

Printed copies of the Bill for the intended Act will be deposited at the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 17th day of December next.

SUTTON DISTRICT WATER.

(Extension of Limits of Supply; Confirmation of Existing and Construction of New Waterworks; Works to Form Part of Undertaking of Company; Additional Lands; Rates, Rents

and Charges; Agreements; Application of Funds; Bye-laws and Penalties; Amendment and Incorporation of Acts, &c.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Sutton District Water Company (hereinafter called "the Company") intend to apply to the Board of Trade on or before the 23rd day of December next, under the Gas and Water Works, Facilities Act, 1870, for a Provisional Order to be confirmed by Parliament in the ensuing Session, for the following purposes or some of them (that is to say):—

1. To extend, alter and define the limits within which the Company may supply water so as to include therein the parish of Kingswood in the rural district of Reigate in the county of Surrey, the boundaries of which parish are defined and edged red on the maps to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned and to extend to and apply within the said limits with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Sutton District Waterworks Acts, 1871 to 1906.

2. To authorize the Company to use, maintain, continue, alter, extend, enlarge, renew and repair the following existing waterworks in the said parish of Kingswood (that is to say):—

Work No. 1.—A line of pipes commencing on the boundary between the parishes of Banstead and Kingswood at Garden Farm on the road between Burgh Heath and Kingswood Station on the Epsom Downs branch of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway and terminating in Waterhouse-lane at the boundary of the parishes of Kingswood and Chipstead.

Work No. 2.—A line of pipes commencing on the boundary between the parishes of Banstead and Kingswood close to the sixth mile stone from Sutton on the road between Sutton and Reigate and terminating at a point in the said road opposite Holly Lodge 319 yards or thereabouts measured along that road in a southerly direction from its junction with the road known as Hogden Bottom,

together with any other mains, branch service or other pipes, filters, meters, valves, fittings and other works, apparatus and conveniences constructed, laid down or used by the Company for the purposes of a supply of water by them in the said parish of Kingswood and to sanction and confirm the acquisition of and to authorize the Company to hold and use any lands, easements or property acquired by them for the purposes of the said works or any of them and to sanction and confirm the expenditure of capital by the Company thereon and for any of the purposes aforesaid.

3. To authorize the Company to construct, use, maintain, alter, extend, enlarge, renew and repair the following new waterworks in the said parish of Kingswood (that is to say):—

Work No. 3.—A line of pipes commencing at the point above described as the termination of Work No. 2 and terminating at the water tower, Work No. 4, hereinafter described.

Work No. 4.—A water tower (not exceeding 60 feet in height), situated in the south-eastern corner of the enclosure numbered 197 on the $\frac{1}{25000}$ Ordnance Map (2nd edition, 1896) of the parish of Kingswood,

together with all such cuts, channels, catchwaters, pipes, conduits, culverts, drains, sluices, bye-washes, shafts, overflows, waste water channels, gauges, filter beds, tanks, banks, walls, bridges, embankments, approaches, engines, machinery and appliances as may be necessary or
