WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred, and known as "The North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900," as amended by an Order in Council bearing date the second day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and known as "The North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1907," it was, amongst other things, provided that certain powers in relation to the territory of North Eastern Rhodesia should be exercised by the Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of the Nyasaland Protectorate:

And whereas it is desirable to transfer the said powers to the High Commissioner for South Africa and to amend the said Orders in Council accordingly:

Now therefore His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty

vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the North-Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1909.

2. Article three of the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900, as amended by the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1907, shall be and is hereby further amended:

(1) by the deletion therefrom of the definition of the term "Governor" and the substitution in place thereof of the following definition: "High Commissioner" means His Majesty's High Commissioner for the time being for South Africa:

(2) by the deletion therefrom of the definition of the term "Military Police Forces" and the substitution in place thereof of the following definition: "Military Police Forces" includes all military volunteer and police forces from time to time raised and constituted in North Eastern Rhodesia and appointed by Regulation or Proclamation to be under the control or authority of the High Commissioner.

3. Wherever in the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1900, as amended by the North Eastern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1907, or in any other Order in Council or in any laws proclamations rules or regulations relating to North Eastern Rhodesia the term "Governor" or "Governor of Nyasaland" is used the term "High Commissioner" shall be read in place thereof: and wherever in the said instruments the term "Queen's Regulation" or "Queen's
