

administrative county of Huntingdon, in any case where they are moved through that county by railway from a place outside that county to another place outside that county without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within that county.

Suspension of Existing Order.

3. The operation of the Order described in the Schedule hereto is hereby suspended during the operation of this Order.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name

or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of December, nineteen hundred and nine.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the SWINE-FEVER (MOVEMENT FROM HUNTINGDONSHIRE) ORDER OF 1909.

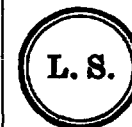
ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.
(DATED 7TH DECEMBER 1909.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1908, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Notwithstanding anything in the Channel Islands Animals Order of 1896, animals brought from the Channel Islands to Great Britain and landed at the Landing Place at Southampton Docks, in the county borough of Southampton, defined by Order of the Board, dated 19th February, 1909, may be moved from the said

Landing Place to the Cattle Shed for Channel Islands Animals situate in the said Docks and abutting on Caute-road, which shed shall be deemed to be a Landing Place for the purposes of the detention, examination, and consequences prescribed by the aforesaid Order of 1896.
