W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirtynine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Alajesty in Council a scheme bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesiy, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of

patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach, in the county of Glamorgan and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in certain trustees upon trust in the first place for John Edwards Vaughan, of Rheola, Neath, in the county of Glamorgan, Esquire, during his life, and the said John Edwards Vaughan is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant.

"And whereas the said John Edwards Vaughan, with a view to securing to the said benefice of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach the augmentation which is hereinafter mentioned, is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach should be transferred to the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, now Bishop of Llandaff, and his successors.

"And whereas the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed will render the same benefice qualified for that augmentation out of funds under our control which is hereinafter mentioned, and will therefore in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach.

"And whereas we have agreed and undertaken to provide and pay to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach and his successors for ever an annual sum of ninetytwo pounds in augmentation of the income of the said benefice as from the date upon which the same benefice shall become qualified as aforesaid for such augmentation.

"And whereas the said grant of an annual sum of ninety-two pounds will, after the publication in the London Guzette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said John Edwards Vaughan, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (in testi-mony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Glyncorrwg with Blaen Gwrach shall be transferred to the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts, and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as the Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the eighteenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words following, that is to say:---

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eight, and of the Act of the twenty-first and twenty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-seven, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme relating to the rectory and parish of Chelsea, in the county of Middlesex and diocese of London.

"Whereas the annual value of the benefice of Chelsea, that is to say, of the rectory of the parish of Chelsea aforesaid (hereinafter called the said benefice), has been improved by means of certain sales of the glebe lands of the said benefice, which sales were effected under the authority of the said Acts by former Rectors or Incumbents and by the present Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Chelsea.

"And whereas the purchase money received in respect of the sales of the said glebe lands and made payable to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, has from time to time as the same has been received by us been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and of such investments there remain standing in the name of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, first, a sum of nine hundred and twenty-five pounds eighteen shillings and one penny London County three pounds per centum stock, and second, a sum of thirty-six thousand and seventy-six pounds fourteen shillings and elevenpence India three pounds per centum stock, all which said sums of stock are now held by us in trust to pay the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said benefice from the said sales payable to us for the benefit of our common fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said benefice arising from or by means of the said sales exceeds the annual sum of one thousand pounds and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our common fund of a portion, namely, thirtythree thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence, of the sum of India three pounds per centum stock hereinbefore mentioned the average annual income of the said benefice will not be left at a less sum than six hundred pounds.

"And whereas the said benefice is now full, the Venerable Henry Edward James Bevan, Archdeacon of Middlesex, being the Rector or Incumbent thereof.

"Now therefore we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that the sum of stock last mentioned, that is to say, the sum of thirty-three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence India three pounds per centum stock, shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice and shall be held by us for the benefit of our common fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned, and that in the event of the said benefice of Chelsea being avoided by the present Rector or Incumbent thereof by retirement under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, and a pension under those Acts being awarded to him, the said transfer of the said sum of stock shall take effect upon the cessation of such pension, and in the event of the said benefice of Chelsea being avoided by the present Rector or Incumbent without the grant of any pension to him under the said Resignation Acts, then the said transfer shall take effect upon such avoidance.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the notice of the foregoing scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said benefice of Chelsea, and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtyseven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year

one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say :---

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parochial chapelry of Coley, and partly out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Lightcliffe, both in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parochial chapelry of Coley and the said new parish of Lightcliffe are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to uppear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parochial chapelry of Coley and of the said new parish of Lightcliffe, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

'And whereas the Reverend George Watkinson of Woodfield, Hipperholme, near Halifax, in the said county of York, Clerk in Holy Orders, has contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of four thousand three hundred pounds towards the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the mainte-nance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November in each and every year to such Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly mentioned Act the sum of one hundred and twenty-nine pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

"And whereas the said capital sum of fou thousand three hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth, "And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the said George Watkinson has nominated the Bishop of Wakefield as the person to whom and to whose successors he desires that the first, third and every subsequent turn of the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall be assigned, and himself, the said George Watkinson, as the person to whom he desires that the second turn of the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall be assigned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parochial chapelry of Coley, and of the said new parish of Lightcliffe, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Matthew, Northowram.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof with the exception of one nomination, namely the second, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, and his successors Bishops of Wakefield, for ever, and that the said second nomination of the said Minister or Incumbent shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said George Watkinson, his heirs and assigns.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Matthew, Northowram, comprising :----

"I. All that portion of the parochial chapelry of Coley, in the county of York and in the diocese of Wakefield, which is bounded upon the northwest by the new parish of Queenshead, upon the south-west partly by the new parish of Saint Thomas, Charlestown, and partly by the new parish of Saint Anne in the Grove, Halifax, upon part of the south-east by the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Lightcliffe, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-east and upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Lightcliffe from the suid parochial chapelry of Coley at the junction of Stony-lane with Wood-lane and extending thence northward along the middle of Wood-lane for a distance of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Wood-lane across the stream called Jum Hole Beck upon the boundary of the urban district of Hipperholme, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the western boundaries of the urban districts of Hipperholme and Shelf (thereby following in part the middle of Jum Hole Beck and the middle of Lumb Brook, in part the middle of the road called Burkley Hill and in part the middle of the road leading from Stone Chair to Queensbury) for a distance of two miles and a half or thereabouts to the junction of the road leading from Stone Chair to Queensbury with Corporal-lane upon the boundary which divides the said parochial chapelry of Coley from the said new parish of Qucenshead.

"II. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Lightcliffe which is bounded upon part of the north and upon the west by the said parochial chapelry of Coley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said paro-chial chapelry of Coley from the said new parish of Lightcliffe at the junction of Stony-lane with the road leading from Stump Cross to Hipperholme and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward, along the middle of the lastmentioned road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close known as Park Field and numbered one upon the map or plan annexed to this scheme and extending thence northward to and along the said fence for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Wood-lane, and extending thence first northward to and then north-westward along the middle of Wood-lane for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Lightcliffe from the said parochial chapelry of Coley.

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Wakefield.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fourth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, in the words and figures following, that is to say:---

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John, Ebbw Vale, situate within the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, in the county of Monmouth and in the diocese of Llandaff.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, and of the new parish (sometime district) of Beaufort, partly in the said county of Monmouth and partly in the county of Brecknock and wholly in the said diocese of Llandaff, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, and of the said new parish of Beaufort should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint John, Ebbw Vale, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, and as the alternate Patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of Beaufort, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, the First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the other new parish of Beaufort (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the

said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, and of the said new parish of Beaufort, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint John, Ebbw Vale, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Ebbw Vale.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Ebbw Vale, comprising :---

"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Christ Church. Ebbw Vale, in the county of Monmouth and in the diocese of Llandaff, which is bounded upon the east, upon the north-east and upon the northwest by the new parish (sometime district) of Beaufort, partly in the said county of Monmouth and partly in the county of Brecknock and wholly in the said diocese of Llandaff, upon the southwest by the new parish of Tredegar, in the said county of Monmouth and in the said diocese of Llandaff, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of the road leading from Tredegar to Ebbw Vale with Man-moel-road where the boundaries of the said new parish of Tredegar, the district chapelry of Saint James. Tredegar, in the said county of Monmouth and in the said diocese of Llandaff, and the said new parish of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, all meet, and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the road leading from Tre-degar to Ebbw Vale for a distance of fifty-three chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Eureka-place, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Eurekaplace for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footway and line of steps leading into the road called Bishop's-place, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said footway and lue of steps for a distance of two chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Bishop's-place, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Bishop's-place for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with Jamesstreet, and continuing thence north eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Ebbw Vale branch line of the London and North Western Railway, and extending thence southward along the mid-lle of the said line of railway for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the roadway leading through Queen's-square into the road running past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Ebbw Vale House towards Marketsquare, and extending thence first eastward to the middle of the said roadway and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of such roadway for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to its junction of the house and premises known as Ebbw Vale House, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Ebbw River upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Ebbw Vale, from the said new parish of Beaufort.

"II. In any earthen grave now existing in the burial ground known as the Church School Ground, burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave; subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

ORE.—Forthwith and entirely in the burial ground known as Ore Cemetery, except as follows :-

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said burial ground, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

In any earthen grave now existing in the said burial ground, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave; subject to the con-dition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
