(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the burial ground known as the Church School Ground, burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave; subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

ORE.—Forthwith and entirely in the burial ground known as Ore Cemetery, except as follows :-

(a.) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said burial ground, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b.) In any earthen grave now existing in the said burial ground, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave; subject to the con-dition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
