PORT OF LONDON (REGISTRATION OF CRAFT) ORDER, 1910.

Order of the Board of Trade under the Port of London Act, 1908, allowing the maximum fees which may be imposed in respect of the registration or licensing of Craft by the Port of London Authority.

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Port of London (Registration of Craft) Order, 1910.
- 2. This Order shall come into force and have effect upon the 9th day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, and that day is in this Order referred to as "the commencement of this Order."
- 3. This Order is to be read and construed subject in all respects to the provisions of the Port of London Act, 1908, and of any other Acts or parts of Acts incorporated therewith, provided that the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such meanings.

The expression "steam tug" means any steam vessel other than a steam barge used for the purpose of towing ships, lighters, barges, or other like craft for carrying goods, wares, or merchandises, or rafts or floats of timber.

The expression "steam barge" means a lighter, barge or other like craft for carrying goods, wares or merchandises propelled by mechanical power.

The expression "canal barge" means a lighter or barge having a beam not exceeding 14 feet 9 inches, and employed in trading on canals communicating with the River Thames.

The expression "canal boat" means a lighter or barge having a beam not exceeding 7 feet 3 inches, and employed in trading on canals communicating with the River Thames.

The word "tonnage" means tonnage by measurement, ascertained according to the rules given in the Third Schedule of the Thames Watermen's and Lightermen's Act, 1893, when applied to vessels not registered under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and

when applied to vessels so registered means the registered tonnage appearing in the register o such vessel.

4. From and after the commencement o this Order the fees which may be imposed by the Port of London Authority in respect of the registration or licensing of craft shall not exceed the fees specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Fees in respect of the registration or licensing of craft, or the renewal of any registration or licence:—

For every steam tug, six pounds.

For every lighter, barge, or other like craft for carrying goods, wares, or merchandises other than a steam barge, canal barge, or canal boat, a sum equal to one shilling for every ton of the tonnage thereof.

For every steam barge, two pounds, and in addition a sum equal to one shilling for every ton of the tonuage thereof.

For every canal barge, one pound.

For every canal boat, seven shillings and sixpence. For a duplicate of any certificate lost or destroyed, five shillings.

For registering the address of a permanent hirer of any one craft, one shilling.

PORT OF LONDON (REGISTRATION OF CRAFT) PROVISIONAL ORDER, 1910.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Board of Trade will shortly introduce into Parliament for confirmation a Provisional Order under the Port of London Act, 1908, allowing the maximum fees which may be imposed in respect of the registration or licensing of craft by the Port of London Authority.

The Provisional Order will be in similar terms to the Order of the Board of Trade dated the 16th February, 1910, published above.

Port of London (Registration of River Craft) Bye-laws, 1910.

Bye-Laws for the Regulation of the Registration of River Craft within the Port of London.

The Port of London Authority in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in them by the Port of London Act, 1908, the Watermen's and Lightermen's Amendment Act, 1859, and the Thames Watermen's and Lightermen's Act, 1893, do make the following Bye-laws, that is to say:—

- 1. The Bye-laws of the Company of Watermen and Lightermen of the River Thames made on the 1st day of November, 1893. and approved by the Conservators of the River Thames on the 27th day of November, 1893, except those numbered 42, 47, 103 and 106, are hereby repealed.
- 2. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Port of London (Registration of River Craft) Bye-laws, 1910," and shall come into operation on the 31st day of March, 1910.
- 3. In these Bye-laws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such meanings:—

The expression "the Port Authority" means the Port of London Authority.

The expression "the limits of the Port of London" means the limits of the Port of London as defined in the Port of London Act, 1908.

The expression "river craft" means river craft as defined in the Port of London Act, 1908.

The expression "steam tug" means any steam vessel other than a steam barge used for the purpose of towing ships, lighters, barges or other like craft for carrying goods, wares or merchandises, or rafts or floats of timber.

The expression "steam barge" means a lighter, barge or other like craft for carrying goods, wares or merchandises propelled by mechanical power.

The expression "canal barge" means a lighter or barge having a beam not exceeding 14 feet 9 inches and employed in trading on canals communicating with the River Thames.

The expression "canal boat" means a lighter or barge having a beam not exceeding 7 feet 3 inches and employed in trading on canals communicating with the River Thames.

The word "tonnage" means tonnage by measurement ascertained according to the rules given in the third schedule of the Thames Watermen's and Lightermen's Act, 1893, when applied to vessels not registered under the provisions of the Merchaut Shipping Act, 1894, and when applied to vessels so registered means the registered tonnage appearing in the register of such vessel.

4. Every person shall on applying to the Port Authority for the registration or for the renewal of the registration of a steam tug, lighter or barge other than a steam barge, or canal barge or canal boat, registered by the Port Authority as such, respectively pay to the Port Authority the sum specified in this Bye-law, that is to say:—

For every steam tug, five pounds.

For every lighter, barge, and other like craft for carrying goods, wares, or merchandises which is not registered by the Port Authority as a steam barge, a sum equal to sixpence for every ton of the tonnage thereof.

5. Every person shall on applying to the Port Authority for the registration or for the renewal of the registration of a steam barge, pay to the Port Authority the sum of two pounds and in addition a sum equal to sixpence for every ton of the tonnage thereof.

6. Every person shall on applying to the Port Authority for the registration or for the renewal of the registration of a canal barge or canal boat furnish a statutory declaration that such canal barge or canal boat is not intended to be used on the tidal waters within the limits of the Port of London on more than seventy-three days during the period for which the registration or reregistration is required and shall pay to the Port Authority the sum specified in this Bye-law that is to say:—

For every canal barge, ten shillings. For every canal boat, five shillings.

- 7. No canal barge or canal boat shall be used on the tidal waters within the limits of the Port of Londou on more than seventy-three days during the period in respect of which the same is registered or re-registered. If any canal barge or canal boat is so used, the sum payable in respect of the registration or re-registration of a lighter, barge, or other like craft for carrying goods, wares or merchandises mentioned in Byelaw 4, shall be payable to the Port Authority in respect of such canal barge or canal boat, and the same shall be recoverable by the Port Authority from the owner or owners there of in like manner as penalties under these Bye-laws are recoverable, or as a debt in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
- 8. The following fees shall, in addition to the sums specified in Bye-law 4, be paid to the Port Authority by the owners of river craft, namely:—

For a duplicate of any certificate lost or destroyed, the sum of five shillings.

For registering the address of a permanent hirer of any one river craft, the sum of one shilling.

9. No lighter, barge, or other like craft used for carrying goods, wares or merchandises registered under the provisions of the Thames Watermen's and Lightermen's Act, 1893, shall be worked or navigated within the limits of the Port of London unless there be painted thereon the name of such lighter, barge, or other like craft, and the name or names of the owner or owners thereof and his or their number, and engraved thereon the tonnage of such lighter, barge, or other like craft to the nearest quarter of a ton of such tonnage, and the number of such lighter, barge, or other like craft in manner following, that is to say:—

The name of such lighter, barge, or other like craft, and the name or names of the owner or owners thereof, and his or their number shall be painted white on a black ground in capital letters not less than three inches long and proportionately broad, and figures not less than six inches long and proportionately broad on the bows of lighters and on the hudds boards, or sterns of barges and other like craft, except in cases where lighters and barges are so constructed that the name thereof, and the name or names of the owner or owners thereof, and his or their number cannot be conspicuously displayed without risk of obliteration on the bows or sterns thereof, in which cases such names and number shall be painted as aforesaid on some part of such lighter or barge so that the same shall always be conspicuously displayed without risk of obliteration and to the satisfaction of the Port Authority or their The tonnage of such lighter, barge, officers. or other like craft, and the numbers thereof, shall be engraved on one of the beams in letters and figures not less than four inches long and proportionately broad.

10. Any person committing an offence against these Bye-laws shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, cap. 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of forty days from the date of this Gazette, to make alterations as shown below in the Regulations for the admission of Candidates to the Civil Service of India, under section 32 of the Statute, 21 and 22 Victoria, cap. 106.

For that part of Regulation 9, which at present stands as follows, viz.:-

"The principal Vernacular Language prescribed for each Province to which Candidates are assigned is as follows:

For the United Provinces of Agra and Oudh, the Punjab, Hindustani. and the Central Provinces...

For Bengal ... Hindustani or Bengali (at the option of the Candidate).

For Eastern Bengal and Assam Bengali (unless it is the Candidate's mother tongue).

For Burma Burmese. For Bombay .. Marathi. Tamil or Telugu For Madras (at the option of the Candidate).

In Hindustani the Candidate will be required to be acquainted with both the Persian and

the Nagari character.

A Candidate assigned to Eastern Bengal and Assam, whose mother tongue is Bengali, must offer for examination Hindustani; and a Candidate assigned to Madras or Bengal, whose mother tongue is either of the languages shown against his Province, must offer the other for examination."

It is proposed to substitute the following, that is to say:

"The principal Vernacular Language prescribed for each Province to which Candidates are assigned is as follows:

For the United Provinces of

Agra and Oudb. the Punjab, and the Central Provinces... Hindustani. For Bengal Hindustani or Bengali (at the option of the Candidate).

For Eastern Bengal and Assam Bengali (unless it is the Candidate's mother tongue).

For Burma Burmese. For Bombay . Marathi (unless it is the Candidate's

mother tongue). For Madras Tamil or Telugue (at the option of the Candidate).

In Hindustani the Candidate will be required to be acquainted with both the Persian and the Nagari character.

A Candidate assigned to Eastern Bengal and Assam, whose mother tongue is Bengali, must offer for examination Hindustani; a Candidate assigned to Bombay, whose mother tongue is Marathi, must offer for examination Hindustani; and a Candidate assigned to Be gal or Madras, whose mother tongue is either of the languages shown against his Province, must offer the other for examination."

It is intended that the changes shall come into force as regards candidates selected at the open competitive examinations of 1910 and subsequent years.

"1. An Examination for admission to the Civil Service of India, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London in August of each year. The date of the examination and the number of appointments to be made for each Province will be announced beforehand by the Civil Service Commissioners.'

It is proposed to substitute the following, that is to say:-

"1. An Examination for admission to the Civil Service of India, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London in August of each year for such number of appointments to that Service as the Secretary of State may on each occasion determine. The date of the each occasion determine. Examination and the number of appointments to be made for each Province will be announced beforehand by the Civil Service Commissioners."

The marks so reduced will be subject to a correspondingly reduced deduction under Clause 6.

"5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks; and the number set opposite to each subject in the preceding Regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

"6. From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject will be made such deduction as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

"7. The Examination will be conducted on paper and vivá voce, as may be deemed necessary.

"8. The marks obtained by each Candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the several Candidates who shall have obtained, after the deduction above mentioned, a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining Candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such Candidates shall be deemed to be Selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided they appear to be in other respects duly qualified. Should any of the Selected Candidates become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled up or not. In the former case the Candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a Selected Candidate."

"From the marks assigned to Candidates in each subject such deduction will be made as the Civil Service Commissioners may deem necessary in order to secure that no credit be allowed for merely superficial knowledge.

"Consistently with the limitations specified above Candidates are at liberty to name any of the foregoing subjects, provided that the maximum number of marks can be obtained from the subjects chosen is limited to 6,000. If this maximum is exceeded by a Candidate's selection he will be required to indicate one of his subjects, the marks for which should, in his case, be reduced so as to bring his maximum marks within the prescribed limit. The marks so reduced will be subject to a correspondingly reduced deduction.

"Moreover, if a Candidate's handwriting is not easily legible a further deduction will, on that account, be made from the total marks

otherwise accruing to him.

"5. A list of the competitors shall be made out in order of their proficiency as disclosed by the aggregate marks finally awarded to each competitor, and in that order so many competitors, up to the determined number of appointments, as are found by the Civil Service Commissioners to be qualified by examination, shall be designated to be Selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India, provided that they appear to be duly qualified in other respects. Should any Selected Candidate become disqualified, the Secretary of State for India will determine whether the vacancy thus created shall be filled or not. In the former case the Candidate next in order of merit, and in other respects duly qualified, shall be deemed to be a Selected Candidate."

In consequence of the proposed alterations specified above the Regulations now numbered 9, 10, 11 and 12 will be numbered 6, 7, 8 and 9 respectively.

It is intended that the changes should come into force for the Open Competitive Examination of 1911 and subsequent years.
