GOVERNMENT NOTICE. No. 75.

Information having been received that infectious or contagious diseases, dangerous to mankind, exist at Bengazi and Algiers, to wit, small-pox at Bengazi and typhus fever at Algiers, it is hereby declared that Bengazi and Algiers are infected places within the meaning of Article 1 of the Regulations made under the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, 1908, and published on the 28th August, 1908.
