TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Wednesday, the 13th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 10 Edw. VII, cap. 4, to the amount of £4,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated the 18th April, 1910, and will be payable at three months after date, viz. :—on the 18th July, 1910.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied*

for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Thursday, the 14th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock on Monday, the 18th April, 1910.

6. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
