ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH APRIL 1910.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swins-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to each of the Scheduled Areas described in the First Schedule hereto, as separate Scheduled Areas for the purposes of that Order. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Areas, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

Revocation of certain existing Application Orders.

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.

Saving of certain existing Local Orders.

3. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the existing local Orders not hereby revoked which modify the provisions of the Salford, Southport, Warrington, and Wigan.

Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 in relation to certain boroughs within the Scheduled Areas.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and ten.
