

situate or by an officer authorised by that Local Authority to grant such permits.

(2.) The permit may be in the form set forth in the Schedule to this Order or to the like effect, and for the purpose of identification, a person granting a permit may mark a horse by affixing a label with the letter **P**, together with the date, a number, or any other matter.

(3.) A permit shall not, unless therein expressly stated, be available for more than two days, including the date of issue.

Production of Permits; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Every person in charge of a horse being shipped, where under this Order a permit is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the permit, if any, authorising the shipment, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector, or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

6. Horses shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (*Police*);

Section forty-four (*General Administrative Provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If any person fails to give such notice as is required by this Order, he shall be deemed

guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a horse is shipped in contravention of this Order, or of a notice prohibiting its shipment, the owner of the horse, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the shipment, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel on which it is shipped shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If a person in charge of a horse being shipped, where under this Order a permit is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, removes or obliterates, or attempts to remove or obliterate, any label affixed to a horse under this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the horse, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and ten.

Short Title.

9. This Order may be cited as the EXPORTATION OF HORSES ORDER OF 1910.
