Joshua Pritchard, now Bishop of Llandaff, and

his successors in the same Bishoprick.

'And whereas the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Saint Bride's Minor, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will render the same benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control and this circumstance will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Saint Bride's Minor.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Earl of Dunraven, being the person whose consent as patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, said Ecclesiastical Commissioners England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted ()rder the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Bride's Minor, shall be transferred to the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved at a Council held by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, under the authority of the said Commission:

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sign Manual, doth hereby by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on behalf of His Majesty, ratify the said scheme, and order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts: and His Royal Highness doth further, on behalf of His Majesty, by and with the like advice, direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

Commission dated the fifth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, to nominate and appoint His Royal Highuess The Prince of Wales, in His Majesty's absence from His Realm in Foreign Parts, to hold on His Majesty's behalf, His Privy Council, and to signify thereat His approval of any matter or thing whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorized by writing under His Majesty's behalf any matter or thing for the purposes of the said Commission whereunto His Royal Highness should be authorized in manner aforesaid.

And whereas there was this day read at a Council held by His Royal Highness under the authority of the said Commission a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the eighteenth October, one thousand nine hundred and nine, we are empowered to offer temporarily to Captains, Commanders and Lieutenants exceptional terms of retirement, with the reservation that such terms are not to be applicable to Officers retired for misconduct, nor to Officers retired for ncn-service after being placed on half-pay by Order of the Admiralty:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the benefits of the scale of retired pay sanctioned by the above-mentioned Order in Council shall be restricted to Officers who, in our opinion, are worthy to receive them:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize us at our discretion to grant retired pay at the rates laid down in the Order in Council of the twenty-second February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, as amended by the Order in Council of the eighth December, one thousand nine hundred and three, in the cases of Officers who, in our opinion, are unworthy to receive the benefits of the new scale:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Now, therefore, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, being authorized thereto by writing under His Majesty's Sigu Manual, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, on behalf of His Majesty, to approve of what is therein proposed, and the
