Kinsale, Jan. 7.

IN my last you had an Account of the Accident befallen the *Mary of London*, bound home from *China*, but it's hoped the Loss will not be so great as was feared at first: The Goods are all brought ashore, where they are now Drying, having taken Wet; and no doubt is made, but the Ship will be got off to be refitted this next Spring Tyde.

Newcastle, Jan. 20. On *Wednesday* last, Sailed from hence about 100 Sail of Laden Colliers, under the Convoy of two Men of War, with a fresh Gale at *West*.

Pembroke, Jan. 20. On the 16th came into this Harbor the *Play-Prize* and the *Roe-Ketch*, to Convoy what Ships are here bound about Land. The same day Arrived here the *Eleanor of Belfast*, Laden with Butter for *Ostend*. The 18th came in a small Portuguese Laden with Salt and Oranges, and bound for *London*. Their Majesties Ships the *Wolfe*, *Prince of Orange*, *Hart-Ketch*, and *Queen-Prize*, are now in this Port, but in a readiness to Sail with the first fair Wind. We have just now an Account, That a Pink of *London*, Captain *Smith* Commander, is Arrived in this Harbor from *Jamaica*, but so much Damned by the ill Weather, that he intends to Hale ashore immediately.

Weymouth, Jan. 21. Yesterday in the Afternoon, came into this Road the *Weymouth-Sloop*, Captain *Rounswall* Commander, with another Privateer who brought in a Ship of 150 Tuns Laden with Salt, supposed to be a French Man, whom they took off of the *Start*. This Morning came in the

Russell-Galley from Cruising on the Coast of *France*, but brings no News.

Plymouth, Jan. 22. Their Majesties Ship the *New-Adventure*, Sailed from hence yesterday to Cruise; and the same day came in the *Elizabeth* of, and from *Dublin*, bound for *Ostend*.

Yarmouth, Jan. 23. Yesterday Morning Sailed out of our Road about 60 Sail of Light Vessels to the Northwards. The *Sun-Prize* went out about Noon. Several Vessels appear now off of this Port coming from the Southward.

Portsmouth, Jan. 24. The *Lenox* and *Expedition-Frigats*, which came the 21st Instant to *Spithead* from the Westward, met the *Dover* last *Wednesday*, having with her a French Privateer of 14 Guns and 60 Men, which she took the day before. The said Privateer was newly come from *St. Malo*.

Deal, Jan. 24. On the 20th came into the *Downes* from the *Buoy of the Nore*, Their Majesties Ships the *Lumley-Castle*, Captain *Misters* Commander. The same day came in also Their Majesties Ship the *Breda*. The 21st, The *Sally-Rose*, with about 16 Sail of Merchant Vessels, arrived in the *Downes*. Yesterday came in the *Forefight*; and the *Sally-Rose* went out to Cruise.

On *Sunday* last, Collonel *Edwyn Stede*, late Lieutenant Governor of Their Majesties Island of *Barbadoes*, (being Introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of *Rochester*) Presented an Address to His Majesty in his Bed-Chamber, from the Grand Jury of that Island: His Majesty Received it very Graciously, and was Pleased, in consideration of the Faithful Services of the said Collonel, to Confer upon him the Honour of Knighthood.
