

Unions, and whose Accounts are not subject to audit by any other District Auditor.

(4) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions; as We may by Order hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Cumberland Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the several Poor Law Unions named in the Schedule to this Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (4) of Article I of this Order.

ARTICLE IV.—In this Order—

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

ARTICLE V.—This Order shall come into operation on the third day of July, one thousand nine hundred and ten, provided that, for the purpose of the giving of notices of any Audit, it shall operate from the date hereof.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Qualifications of Poor Law Nurses: Dispensing with requirements of Orders.

SWANSEA UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Swansea Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by an Order, dated the 27th day of January, 1892 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1892"), We, the Local Government Board, made Regulations with regard to the appointment by the Guardians of the Poor of any Union or Separate Parish in England and Wales of District Nurses to perform the duties therein set forth, and by Article III of that

Order it is provided that no person shall be appointed to the office of District Nurse who has not undergone, for one year at least, a course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of a Hospital or Infirmary being a Training School for Nurses and maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon;

And whereas by the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1897"), We directed that, from and after the 29th day of September, 1897, certain Regulations should, except in so far as We might assent to a departure therefrom, be in force in the several Poor Law Unions for the time being in England and Wales with respect to the nursing of the sick poor in Workhouses, and the appointment, qualification, and duties of Nurses, including Superintendent Nurses, therein; and by Article III (3) of that Order it is provided that any Superintendent Nurse appointed after the commencement of the Order shall, unless We dispense with the requirement, be a person qualified for the appointment by having undergone, for three years at least, a course of instruction in the Medical and Surgical Wards of any Hospital or Infirmary being a Training School for Nurses, and maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon;

And whereas the Infirmary of the Workhouse of the Swansea Union is a Training School for Nurses, and it is expedient that in other respects the said Infirmary should be made available for the purposes of the qualifications to which the above-cited provisions relate:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to us by the Statutes in that behalf; We hereby Order and Direct as follows:—

For the purposes of Article III of the Order of 1892 and of subdivision (3) of Article III of the Order of 1897 the Infirmary of the Workhouse of the Swansea Union shall be deemed to be an Infirmary maintaining a Resident Physician or House Surgeon throughout the period during which the Medical Officer or an Assistant Medical Officer of the Workhouse devotes his whole time to the duties of his office, and resides near the Workhouse.
