Yesterday arrived the Concard of this place in 6 weeks from Barbado's, from whence the came int company of about 20 fail of Merchant Ships under the Convoy of the Dover and Affurance Fregares. They tell us that the Inhabitants of Bridgetown are buily employing themfelves for materials for the rebuilding of that place; and have emploied many thips for the transportation of timber from New England.

Deal, Aug. 3. Yesterday in the morning failed out of the Downs the Refolution. Warfpight, and Rupers, intending for Portfmouth, where they are to be paid off and laid up. Several Merchant Ships patied likewife out of the Downs, and aboue 30 fail arrived from forreign parts. About 4 in the afternoon arrived there the Sufanna with refail of Merchant Ships under her Convoy; and about 3 bours: after the Dover with 13 fail \$ all of them from the Barbado's. These later coming thence about 6 weeks faces a which time the Bonawature was dispatched from thence for St. Chriftophers, with form Orders touching the Reftoring of the English part of that Illand, in which Mo they is Barro would form to rails forme difficulties.

Prince Borghest is by the Emperature declared his Ambalfadour Batraordinary, for performing the Geremony of gis ving Obedience to His Holines; for which he is making preparations of rich Coaches and Liveries.

The Jesuits have lately exhibited to His Holinels a great Complaint against Eather Oligen General of their Orders representing to him feveral defects in his Government, and that he takes not the advice of those that ought to be his Alfultants, and generally observes not the Confitutions of the Order & the confideration whereof is by the Pope commuted m the confideration of a Congregation of Cardinals of the Three Orders, who are to hear, examine, and make report to His Holinels.

The Pope is much troubled at the King of *Polands* Refolution to refign his Crown and tettre himfelf from alk Publick Affairs, and intends to diffatch to him fome Perfon of Reputation to diffwade him from a Refolution which he fears may involve that Kingdome in great troubles & and in the mean time has ordered that Solema Prayers be made in all Churches for the happy deliverance of that Kingdome from all those diffurbances which feem to threaten them.

On Friday laft in the Evening's Conneftable Coloand with the Dutchelle his Lady, departed hence for Milan, upont advice received of the arrival in thole parts of the Dutchelle Mazarini from France; having before their departure enterthinged Complements with the Houles of Chigi and Rolpigliof, and received a Vilis from the French Ambelladour incognito.

Vienna, July 25. The 19 inftant's Courier was dipatcher to Spain with Complements to that Court, and to give the Queen Regeneties good news of the Empresses being with Child.

The Emperour out of his timely providence for the fecurity of the pace in Poland during the Seffion of the enfuing Diets and the election of a Succeffor to that Crown, has ordered feveral Regiments to march into Silefia, where they are to Quarter, and to be in continual readine is to march upon the first Orders.

Another Chiaus is upon his way hither with freih complaints from the Baffa of Buda againft the Huffars, who continue their violencies upon the frontiers, where they have tately feifed on an Herd of above 500 Cattle belonging to the Turks; but his greaten bulinels is faid to be to Negoriate within Courrwith His Imperial Majefty, that no encouragement, may be given from hence for the Election of the young Prince of Mufcour in fuecced to the Crown of Poland.

On Sunday morning laft, the young Prince of Lorain departed hence, but for what place is not certainly known; but asy its gueffed, for Poland.

as tis gueffed, for Poland. Their Imperial Majefties intend in fow days to leave this place to pais fome time at Ebersdorff.

The Baron de Geers, Envoye Extraordinary from his Highnelsthe Marquisof Brandenburg, who lately arrived here front Ratisbonne, continues as yer here, negotiating about the future election in Poland.

Jestice, July 28; Erop Conflantinople we have leveral advices which inform us, that the Grand Seignior being much diffatisfy dwith the diconnents of his peoples whomake the liberty is all his Provinces to confure his Government, and to murnut againil his Grand Millers, for the ill facels he has had in Candia, was refolved to trainfort himfelf from Conflattinople to Thebes in Morea, by his neeraels we encu-, rage the Siege, and take fore for the lending fuch tecruiss to the. Viller, assnight enable him to gottmough the Work.

The Jurkish Fleet lies plying about the waters of Scioj confilling of about 50 Gallies, and 24 men of war belonging ing to Farbary, all of them under the Command of the Captain Baffa, who being nearly related to the Grand Vi-Candia, attending every motion of the Enemy.

They farther rell us, that Captain Gardi a Privateer, had lately feis'd upon two French thips which were preffed at Constantinople, and tent with Provisions for Canca ; that the Furks continued fiff their Siege with much relolution, but by realon of the vigilancy of our Fleet. had to great a dearth amongst them, that a pound of fair flesh was fold amongst them for 40 Alpers, and a pound of Bilcuit or bread for 20; that by realon of the frequent refort of all the Christian Privateers to Candia to fell off their Prizes, all forts of provisions abounded amongst them in extensiondinary, p'onky ; and that 'a French Privateer had near Caned taken a large veffel laden with Tobacco and Aquidutta, endeavouring to put in there from Morea.

Monsielie de St. Andre Montbryn is to the great encouragement of the beliegeds fafely artived in Landia with a confiderable number of from foldiers; and to flynalize himfelf by fome action upon the Enemy with a ftrong party, made a four fally upon these of them which lay before the Fort di Sabionera, beating them out of their Trenches with extrordinary flanghter, destroying a Work they had caft up againft the Fort, and resurning with light loss and much honour into the Town.

They also inform us that oup A dmiral Monofini is lately fallen into a Feavourish diffemper, occasion'd by a Cold, which obliges thim to pitt into Suda for his recovery, having In the mean while given fich Orders for the Command of the Fleet, as may belt fuit with the publick Interest. He likewife ordered the' Provesitor General Marco Catarin Cornaro to paísinto Candia no Command as General of the forces there, during the indipolition of General Mani, and lent in confiderable supplies of all forts for the defence of aliat place.

Hambourgh's Aug. 7. The Bishop of Eessers returned From his Embally in Poland, is lome few dayes fince departed heiderfor Amsterdam, having received Orders from his Master the Most Christian King f.r. his speedy return home.

From Warfat we are informed that His Majefty of Pe land continuing his refolution of laying down his Regality, has bestowed the furniture of his House amongst his domeflick fervants, and given to the Jefuits Nicporen and Bia. lalensko, rwo Villages which he formerly purchased. The Nobi ity are divided as yet in their Opinions touching the Election of a Succeffor to the Crown : but for their more uniforme proceeding in a bufinels of this grand importance, they intended to meet the 23th pair to conferrogether , and to form some instructions, which they intended to lend by their Deputies to the grear Convention of Effates at Warfams which is to be allembled the 13th of this moneth.

They farther-tell us that -a Tutkish Chiaus was apon his way intending for Warfam, being fent thither from the Grant Vilier, to affure His Majefty of the real friendship he had for the Kingdom of Boland : but 'tis generally concluded that his grand defign is to endeavour to prevent the Election of the young Prince of Moscovy to the Crown of Poland. Kis faidalfo that the Tartars are as zealous againft this Election of the Mokovite as the Turks , and that the Cham of Tartary is lending Dedes Aga to obkruct it + who is allo upon his way from Lemberg,

Paris, Aug. 11. His Majesty intends to soon as the Queen has recover'd her firength, to take a journey to Blois and chamberg, where he will continue about a moveth.

Three days fince arrived at the Court, the Duke de Beaufors, giving His Majefty a fatisfactory account of his Fleers a great part whereof he has difarmed and laid up at Breft and Rochel.

His Majefly has made choice of the Marquis de Vi, lars. to be feut into Spain to Complement the Queen Regent, and to give her the news of the birth of a young Duke d'Anjous intending to lend others perfons to Rome and Vienna upog the fame account,

The Molcovice Ambaffador in his Return from Spaia is lately arrived at a Calle within two Leagnes of Burdeauxa from whence he has given His Majefty the news of his arrival-and that he had fome bufinels to negotiate with his Majesty from the Grear Duke his Master, but that he could not come to the Court, till his Majefty had first given Orden for the defraying his expences upon the way. Whereupon His Majeity fent the Sieur de Casheus one of the Gentlemen. of his Houfhold to attend him with Moneys for his entertainmencon his journey hither.

From leveral parts of Picardy we have the ill news of the encrease of the Plague, to the great affliction of the peoples. and that it rages with much violence in feveral parts of Hig Majeffles late Conquest in Flanders.

Portfmouth, Aug 4. One of His Majefties men of Waslately cruiting about the Channel, informs us, that he met with two Spanish ships near the Cossis, who told him they were part of a lquadrow of 6 ships which were attending Den Fuan to Oftend, and if the weather had been clear, bo might have discovered, the test, and tis supposed they are ere

The fame day, Sir Daniel Harvy , Knight, His, Majer fies Ambaliador to the Grand Seignior, took his leave of his Maiefty at Whitehell, and the fame Evening went aboard one of His Majelties Pleasure-boats in Order to his Imbarcation upon a Man of War which lay ready to attend him in the Downs.

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
