WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Hertford) Order, 1910.

Dated 10th August, 1910.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Hertford, I hereby make the following Order :--

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Hertford) Order, 1910."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Hertford so as to be between the 14th day of February and the 16th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the Administrative County of Hertford as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:---

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance: Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 11, 1909;

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after August 7, 1910, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Nicolajeff shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition so far as bedding and underclothing are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit :

To goods which have arrived from Nicolajeff but which can be shown to have come from elsewhere, and which are packed in such a manner as to render it impossible that they should have been in contact with infected objects;

'II. As regards transit :

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot undergo any operation of manufacture on the way.

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
