#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Hertford) Order, 1910.

Dated 10th August, 1910.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Hertford, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Hertford) Order, 1910."

#### BIRDS.

#### Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Hertford so as to be between the 14th day of February and the 16th day of August in any year.

### Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the Administrative County of Hertford as is within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species

of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Baillons Crake, Carolina (Olivaceous) Crake, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Spotted Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Pintail Duck, Tufted Duck, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Gadwall, Garganey, Hawfinch, Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Heron. Hobby, Kestrel, Linnet, Magpie, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Red-backed Shrike, Great Grey Shrike, Lesser Grey Shrike, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Longtailed Tit, Blue-headed Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Waxwing, Wheatear, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Whinchat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within so much of the Administrative County of Hertford as is not within the Metropolitan Police District to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—
