**FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST.**

In pursuance of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, His Majesty's Postmaster-General hereby gives notice that a Warrant, dated the 9th day of August, 1910, and coming into operation on the 12th day of August, 1910, has been made on his representation, by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, relating to the rates of postage on parcels transmitted from an Agency of the Postmaster-General at a Morocco Port to places outside Morocco (other than the United Kingdom) by way of Gibraltar.
