

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 10th August, 1910.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-Districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Axminster Sub-district of Axminster Registration District should be united with Chardstock Sub-district of the same Registration District, and that the enlarged Sub-district should be called and known as Axminster Sub-district;—

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on 1st day of September, nineteen hundred and ten.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 10th August, 1910.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that the Sub-districts of Llanely Registration District should be re-arranged in the following manner, viz.:— (a) that the parts of Llanely Rural Civil Parish now situated in Llanely, Loughor, and Llannon Sub-districts respectively should be detached therefrom, and that the entire Civil Parish should be constituted by itself a separate Sub-district to be called and known as Llanely Rural Sub-district; (b) that Llanely Sub-district as thus reduced, and consisting only of Llanely Urban District, should be re-named Llanely Urban Sub-district; (c) that Loughor and Gowerton Civil Parishes, being situated in the administrative county of Glamorgan, should be detached from Loughor Sub-district and together be constituted a separate Sub-district by themselves to be called and known as Loughor Sub-district; and (d) that Llangennech Civil Parish (now forming part of Loughor Sub-district) and Llannon and Llanedy Civil Parishes (now forming part of Llannon Sub-district) should be detached from those respective Sub-districts and together be constituted a separate Sub-district by themselves to be called and known as Llannon Sub-district.

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, nineteen hundred and ten.
