# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF · AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 11TH AUGUST 1910.)

YORKSHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1910 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1909, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Alteration of Scheduled Districts.

1. From and after the fourteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and ten, the provisions of the Yorkshire (Foot - and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1910 (No. 3), dated the second day of August, nineteen hundred and ten, shall have effect as if the First, Second, and Third Schedules to this Order were therein respectively substituted for the First, Second, and Third: Schedules to the said first-mentioned Order, subject to the modifications hereinafter contained.

## Modifications as to Scheduled District No. III referred to in this Order.

, 2.. From and after the commencement of this, Order, cattle, sheep, or swine may be moved out of the District described in the Third Schedule hereto to any slaughterhouse not situate in the District described in the First Schedule hereto, if accompanied by a Movement Licence authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animals are to be moved are situate, and provided that in any case in which the place of destination is not situate in either of the Districts described in the Second or Third Schedules hereto each animal is marked before the movement is commenced, by and at the expense of the owner, in manner following:-

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow A about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

eep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow A on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.

## · Licences.

3.—(1.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to the Yorkshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order

Authority of the District in which is situate the slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, if such slaughterhouse is situate in another District.

#### Short Title, &c.

4. This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1910 (No. 4), and shall be read with the Yorkshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1910 (No. 3).

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

Scheduled District No. I.

A District comprising such portions of the parishes of Kirkby Malzeard, Grewelthorpe, and Azerley, in the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, as lie within the following boundary, but excluding any road or lane which forms such boundary:

Commencing at the Market Cross at Kirkby Malzeard, and proceeding thence in a southerly and easterly direction along Warren-lane to the north-eastern end of the village of Galphay opposite the Methodist Chapel, thence in a northerly direction along the lane by Owster House to the south-eastern corner of a pasture field called Haverland Field, thence along the southern and western boundary fences of that field to Hubber-lane, thence north-easterly along that lane by Mill Farm and Azerley Chase to its junction with the road from Grewelthorpe to Ripon, thence north-westerly along that road through the village of Grewelthorpe to its junction with the main road from Kirkby Malzeard, thence southerly along the said main road to the point of commencement.

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

#### Scheduled District No. II.

The petty sessional division of Kirkby Malzeard (except the parishes of Studley Roger, Lindrick with Studley Royal and Fountains, and Aldfield), and the parish of Grantley, in the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, but excluding such portions of the parishes of Kirkby Malzeard, Grewelthorpe, and Azerley, as are com-prised within the District described in the First Schedule to this Order.

#### THIRD SCHEDULE.

## Scheduled District No. III.

The petty sessional division of Ripon Liberty excluding the parishes of Nidd and Grantley; the borough of Ripon and the parishes of Fountains Earth, Studley Roger, Lindrick with Studley Royal and Fountains, and Aldfield, in the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire; and the parishes of Marton le Moor, Hutton Conyers, Melmerby (in the petty sessional division of Hallikeld), Norton Conyers, Wath, Middleton Queinhow, Sutton Howgrave, Howgrave, Kirkof 1910 (No. 3) or to the like effect.
