LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Derwent Valley Light Railway (Extension of Time) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them reviving the powers granted by the Derwent Valley Light Railway Orders, 1902 and

1907, for the compulsory purchase of lands, and extending the periods limited by those Orders for the same and for the completion of the Railway and Works thereby authorised.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated August 16th, from His Majesty's Minister at The Hague forwarding the following translation of a Decree of the Netherlands Government, dated August 15th, respecting the importation of rags &c., from Kronstadt:—

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance: Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 11, 1909;

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after August 17, 1910, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Kronstadt shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition so far as bedding and underclothing are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from Kronstadt but which can be shown to have come from elsewhere, and which are packed in such a manner as to render it impossible that they should have been in contact with infected objects:

II. As regards transit:

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot undergo any operation of manufacture on the way.

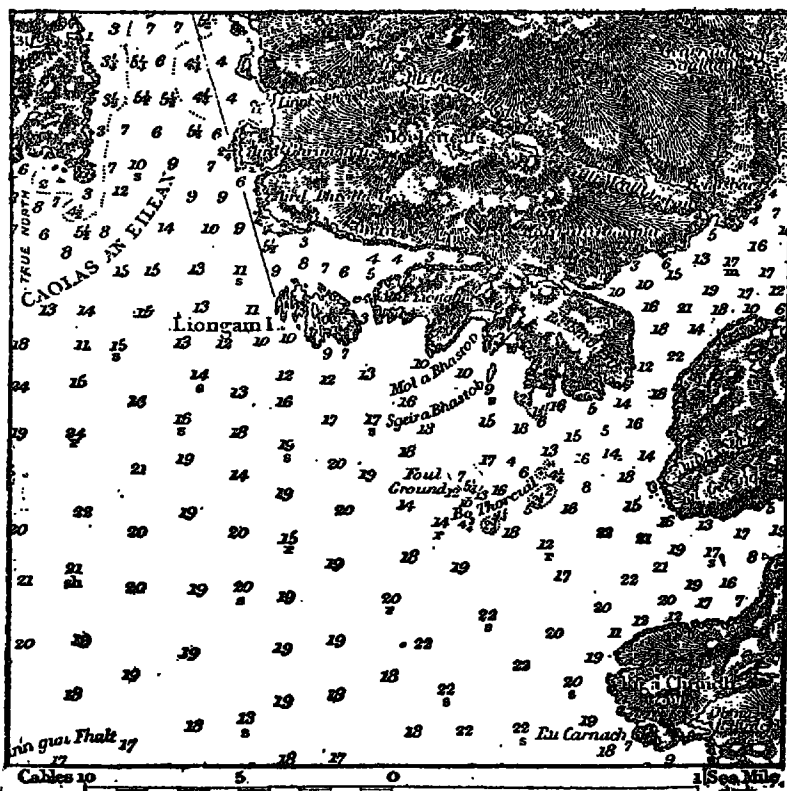
