LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Llandudno and Colwyn Bay Light Railway
(Extension No. 2) Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorising the construction of Light Railways in the Urban District of Colwyn Bay and Colwyn in the county of Denbigh, and in the rural district of Conway in the county of Carnarvon (being an extension of the undertaking authorised by the Llandudno and Colwyn Bay Light Railway Orders, 1898 to 1907).

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.
