Caution.—Vessels are hereby warned that from the 27th September to the 10th October, 1910, gun-practice will be carried out at night by a number of His Majesty's ships in Moray Firth. The firing will take place within a distance of about 5 miles on either side of a line joining Tarbet Ness and Covesea Lighthouse, and at about 4 miles from either shore.

THE LOCOMOTIVES ACT, 1898.

Supplementary Bye-law.

NOTICE is hereby given, that after the expiration of one calendar month from the 20th day of September, 1910, application will be made to the Local Government Board for the confirmation of a supplementary Bye-law, regulating the use of locomotives, and of wagons drawn by locomotives, made and adopted by the County Council of the administrative county of Worcester; and notice is also hereby given that a copy of such Bye-law will be kept at the office of the Clerk of the said County Council, at the Shirehall, Worcester, and be open to the inspection of the ratepayers of the said county without fee or reward, on any weekday, other than Thursdays, between the hours of 10 A.M. and 5 P.M., and on Thursdays between the hours of 10 A.M. and 1 P.M., during the period of one calendar month from the 20th day of September, 1910.

The Clerk of the said County Council will, on the application of any such ratepayer, furnish him with a copy of such proposed Bye-law, or any part thereof, on payment of sixpence for every hundred words in such copy.
