The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated October 5th, from His Majesty's Representative at Rouen, stating that in accordance with Sanitary Regulations just issued at the port of Rouen, all vessels from the following ports must stop at Havre, and there be subjected to quarantine inspection before proceeding to Rouen:—

- "Russian and Finnish ports in the Baltic.
- " Ports in the White Sea.
- "German Baltic ports, from and including the Russian German frontier to Dantzig.
- "All Italian ports, including the Islands of Sicily and Sardinia.
 - "Austrian ports in the Adriatic.
 - "All Russian and Turkish Black Sea Ports.
- "Constantinople and all Turkish ports in the Sea of Marmara."
