diocese of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Exwick, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Exwick.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Andrew, Exwick, in the said county and

diocese, being :-

"All that portion of the said parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, which is bounded upon the south by the consolidated chapelry of Emmanuel, Exeter, in the said county and diocese, upon the north-east and upon the north by the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Exwick, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Exwick, from the said parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, at a point in the middle of the high road which leads from Okehampton to Exeter near its junction with the road leading from Exwick to Whitestone Cross, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said high road for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, from the said consolidated chapelry of Emmanuel,

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and also the Incumbent of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Exwick, have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of the said notices and the Incumbent of the said parish of Saint Thomas the Apostle, Exeter, has not raised any objections to the said scheme:

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and seven, of the Act of the second and third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the first and second years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and seven; of the Act of the second and third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fortynine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint George, Waterlooville, situate in the extra parochial place or liberty called Waterloo, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint George, Waterlooville, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all the said extra parochial place or liberty called Waterloo, together with all that part of the parish of Catherington, in the said county and diocese, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is, with the said extra parochial territory, delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint George, Waterlooville, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named Chapelry of Saint George, 'The District Waterlooville.

"And with the like consent of the said Herbert Edward Bishop of Winchester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint George, Waterlooville, situate as afore-said, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices pursuant to the said Acts.
