land Railway two pounds ten shillings per centum per annum debenture stock and a sum of four hundred pounds London and South Western Railway three pounds per centum per annum debenture stock and the same have been transferred into our name to be held by us towards the endowment of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sums of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sums of stock and to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of one hundred and thirty

pounds eight shillings and ninepence.

"And whereas the said sums of stock have been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds.

"And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us, the said Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty,

chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Henry Edmund, Viscount Mountgarret, has contributed a sum of three thousand pounds towards the cost of providing a permanent church within and for the said proposed separate district, and this contribution has been made upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which

is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said Henry Edmund, Viscount Mountgarret, has nominated as the person or persons, to whom he desires that the first turn of the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall be assigned, himself, the said Henry Edmund, Viscount Mountgarret, or in case of his death before the exercise of such first turn of patronage the Reverend George Body, Doctor in Divinity and Canon Residentiary of the Cathedral Church of Durham, George Ackroyd, of Harden Hall, near Bingley, in the county of York, wool comber, Herbert James Jeffery, of Bradford, in the county of York, solicitor, and the Reverend Charles Wynne Mosse, of the College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders, or the

survivors or survivor of them, and has also nominated the Warden, Council, and Scholars of Keble College, Oxford, as the College to which he desires that, with the exception of the. said first turn of patronage, the whole right of the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall be assigned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Manningham, and of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, portions together which with boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'the district of

Saint Chad, Manningham.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof, with the exception of one nomination, namely the first, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Warden, Council, and Scholars of Keble College, Oxford, and their successors for ever, and that the said first nomination of the said minister or incumbent shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Henry Edmund, Viscount Mount-garret, or in case of his death before the exercise of the said first nomination by the said George Body, George Ackroyd, Herbert James Jeffery, and Charles Wynne Mosse, or the survivors or survivor of them.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or any other

Act of Parliament."
"The Schedule to which the foregoing

scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Chad, Manningham, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district) of Manningham, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Philip, Girlington, both in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, upon part of the north-east by the new parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north-east, upon the
