LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

The Board of Trade have recently confirmed the undermentioned Orders made by the Light Railway Commissioners:—(1) Portsmouth and Hayling Light Railway (Extension of Time) Order, 1910, reviving the powers granted by the Portsmouth and Hayling Light Railway Order, 1905, for the compulsory purchase of lands, and extending the periods limited by that Order for the same, and for the completion of the light railway and works thereby authorized; (2) Weston-super-Mare Junction Light Railway Order, 1910, authorizing the construction of a light railway in the urban district of Weston-super-Mare, in the county of Somerset, connecting the Weston, Clevedon and Portishead Light Railway with the tramways of the Weston-super-Mare and District Electric Supply Company Limited.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated November 7th, from His Majesty's Minister at The Hague, forwarding the following translation of a Decree, dated November 4th/5th, respecting the importation and transit of rags, &c., from Tripoli (Africa):—

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance:

Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 10th, 1910;

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after November 7th, 1910, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Tripoli (Africa) shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:—

1. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from Tripoli (Africa), but which can be shown to have come originally from elsewhere, and which have been so transported and are packed in
