THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

RURAL DISTRICT OF CREDITON.

NOTICE is hereby given, that pursuant to section 3 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, the Local Government Board have issued an Order, dated the 23rd day of November, 1910, declaring, specifying and directing that from and after the 4th day of January, 1911, sections 30, 31, 32 and 33 comprised in Part II, and sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 44, 45 and 46 comprised in Part III, of the Act of 1907, shall be in force in the several contributory places within the district; and that sections 39, 40, 41 and 42 comprised in Part III of the same Act shall be in force in the contributory places of Bow or Nymet Tracey, Cheriton Bishop, and Zeal Monachorum within the district, subject to the conditions and adaptations attached by the Order to the sections specified in the schedule to the Order.

PART III.

Section thirty-five "This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875."

"Bye-laws made in pursuance of section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances, shall not in relation to any subject matter of this section be of any force or effect in any contributory place within the district."

Section thirty-eight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exercisable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."
