### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinu-

ance of burials thereunder, or other operation

of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 8th day of February, 1890, directing the discontinuance of burials in the Parish Church of Bovey Tracey, in the county of Devon, and, with certain exceptions, in the churchyard:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 8th day of February, 1890, in so far as it affects burials in the said churchyard should be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the 8th day of February, 1890, be varied so that, notwithstanding anything therein, the burial of the bodies of members of the Hole family, at their decease, may be allowed in that portion of the said churchyard which was added thereto in or about the year 1887, subject to the condition that no part of the coffins containing the bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities VV Act, 1838, after reciting "Whereas in some instances tithings, lets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for Ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for Ecclesiastical purposes: And the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.

And whereas by section 6 of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, enacted "That any such scheme or modification as aforesaid may be drawn up according to the regulations and directions in the hereinbefore in part recited Act contained, subject to the consent in writing of the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected thereby, under his or their hands, notwithstanding the vacancy of such benefice or benefices; and that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council thereupon to make an Order for carrying such scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect, and that such Order being registered in the Registry of the Diocese as directed by the hereinbefore in part recited Act shall come into operation, and shall be forthwith binding on all persons whatsoever notwithstanding such vacancy or vacancies."

And whereas the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Salisbury, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:-

'I John by Divine Permission Bishop of Salisbury Do in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act 1838 hereby repre-

sent to Your Grace as follows:

"There is in the County of Dorset and my Diocese of Salisbury the United Benefice of Great Toller or Toller Porcorum and Little Toller or Toller Fratrum with the Parochial Chapelry of Wynford Eagle annexed with a population of 497 or there-

"There is a Church and a residence house at both Great Toller and Little Toller respectively and a Church at Wynford Eagle but

no residence house.
"The income of the United Benefice is as

"The nett annual value of the said United Benefice is £269 or thereabouts arising from a Grant made by the Queen Victoria Clergy Fund, tithe rent charge,

glebe rents and other sources.
"There is also in the said County and Diocese the Rectory of Compton Abbas West or West Compton, the Ecclesiastical parish whereof contains a population of 45. nett annual value of this Benefice £91 8s. 3d. and the Church accommodation

is 80.
"The boundaries of the Chapelry of and the Church is about two miles from the Church of West Compton.

"It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act 1838 the said Chapelry of Wynford Eagle, may be advantageously separated from the United Benefice of Great and Little Toller and be annexed to the said parish of West Compton

to which it is contiguous.
"The United Benefice of Great and Little Toller with Wynford Eagle is in the patronage of Colonel Robert Williams, M.P., of Bridehead in the County of Dorset afore-said and the Benefice of West Compton is

in the patronage of the Lord Wynford.
"The Benefics of West Compton is vacant. The Reverend David Clarke is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Great and Little Toller with Wynford Eagle.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Act of Parliament hereinbefore mentioned I the said Bishop have therefore drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rentcharges, and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the Consents thereto in writing of the aforesaid Patrons and Incumbents to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme, you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council.'

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:-

" SCHEME.

"That that part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Great and Little Toller with Wynford Eagle which is known by the name of the Chapelry of Wynford Eagle aforesaid shall be separated therefrom and united for Ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of West Compton or Compton Abbas

"That the Incumbent of the Benefice of West Compton shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Chapelry of Wynford Eagle so annexed to

West Compton.
"That the parishioners of the Chapelry aforesaid of Wynford Eagle shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Churches of Great or Little Toller except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches of Great or Little Toller and who may not desire to give up or relinquish the same.

That the inhabitants of the aforesaid Chapelry of Wynford Eagle shall have such and the same right to have Marriages, Baptisms, Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed and other rights in the Parish Church of West Compton or Compton Abbas West as they might have had in the Parish Churches of Great and Little Toller or either

of them.

That all pew dues Ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said Chapelry shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of West Compton.

"That the whole of the Vicarial tithe rent charge arising from land in the said Chapelry

heretofore forming part of the Endowment of the United Benefice of Great and Little Toller with Wynford Eagle and payable to and received by the Vicar of the said Benefice amounting in gross according to the commuted value to £150 0s. 0d. (the particulars whereof are set out in the Schedule annexed hereto) shall in future form part of and be annexed to the Endowment of the

said Benefice of West Compton and shall be payable to and received by the Rector for the time being of the said Benefice of West Compton

Compton.

"Except as aforesaid no other alteration shall be made in the Endowments of the said Benefices or either of them and no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said Benefices or either of them."

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same, and the Consents aforesaid, to His Majesty in Council, by his Report dated the 7th day of July, 1910, which said Report is in the words and figures following:

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:

- 1. The importation of the following articles is prohibited:—
  - (a) Coffee beans or ground coffee, coloured with substances injurious to health;

(b) Vines and fruit packed in vine leaves;(c) Grapes, unless accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate signed by the

proper authority and unless subjected to examination by the Inspector of Agriculture on arrival:

arrivai;

- (d) Cotton seed, unless accompanied by a certificate from the British Consular Authority, or where there is no such authority, from the local Government Authority, to the effect that anthrax is not prevalent in the district in which such cotton seed was grown;
- (e) Potatoes imported from England or Scotland, unless accompanied by the following documents, viz.—
  - (i) A Statutory Declaration by the shipper, naming the place of origin and stating that such potatoes were not grown on land infected with Black Scab;
  - (ii) A Certificate from an Officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, stating that the locality in which the potatoes were grown is free from that disease.

Consignments of potatoes not accompanied by the documents above mentioned shall, on importation, be liable to be inspected, at the expense of the consignee, by the Inspector of Agriculture, who may give such directions and take such steps as he may consider necessary.

Paragraph (b) of this article does not apply to the United Kingdom.

- 2. The importation of cuttings or shoots of the American or other vines, except from the United Kingdom, is prohibited, unless the goods are accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate, in accordance with the Berne International Conference of 1881, signed before a British Consular Authority, or unless the goods be subjected to examination and disinfection by the Inspector of Agriculture.
- 3. The importation of plants, roots or garden soil from any port in the Mediterranean is prohibited, unless the goods be accompanied by an antiphylloxeric certificate signed by the proper authority.
- 4. Cereals imported in infected ships shall be kept for 21 days at the Lazaretto, or other place to be appointed by the Superintendent of Public Health, and shall be aired under the direction of the Quarantine Authorities.
- 5. The words "infected ships" in these regulations have the same meaning as in the Regulations published by Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th August, 1908.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

Parish of Welwyn.

To the County Council of Hertford:—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Hertford for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that subsection in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate within the parish of Welwyn, in the county of Hertford:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the said parish of Welwyn which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

### SCHEDULE.

So much of the main road from Hatfield to Hitchin (including High-street) passing through the village of Welwyn, as extends from a point 30 yards south of the southern boundary of the premises of the School near the top of Welwyn Hill to a point 30 yards north of the junction of the road with the main road leading to Ayot St. Lawrence and Kimpton.

So much of the main road leading from Welwyn to the railway station as extends from its junction with the main road first above described to the southern extremity of the gas works; and

So much of the main road from Welwyn to Stevenage (including North-street) as extends from its junction with High-street to the northeast side of the entrance to Wendover Lodge.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH DECEMBER 1910.)

NORFOLK (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

# Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

- 2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from horses, asses and mules not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass or mule so affected or suspected is.
- (2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

- 3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.
- (2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## Detention of Animals.

- 4.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass or mule which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—
  - (i.) The horse, ass or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under

the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

- (ii.) No other horse, ass or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
- (iii.) No horse, ass or mule shall be allowed to stray out of the stable, shed, field or other premises.
- (2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (3.) An Inspector shall with all practicable speed send a copy of any Notice served under this Article to the Local Authority and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District.

# Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:
  - (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange;
  - (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected;
  - (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee or occupier;
  - (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses or mules of litter used for or about any horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feedingtrough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
  - (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee or occu-

pier of the place to be cleaned and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

# Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

- 6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.
- (2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

# Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section 43 (Police);

Section 44 (General Administrative Provisions);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

# Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

# Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a horse, ass or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of any Notice thereunder, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any horse, ass or mule is allowed to stray in contravention of this Order, or of any Notice thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the premises from which the animal is allowed to stray, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleaned and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

# Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector;
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

### Extent.

11. This Order extends to the administrative

county of Norfolk; and the county boroughs of Norwich and Great Yarmouth.

### Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and ten.

### Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the Norfolk (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1910.
