GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by Articles 38 and 44 of the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, has been pleased to approve of the following amendment to the Regulations for the prevention of contagious, infectious and epidemic diseases published by Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th August, 1908 (as amended by Government Notices Nos. 199, 214, 243 and 290 of 1910),

The paragraph which was added by Government Notice No. 243 of the 30th September last, after paragraph (c) of Article 1 of. Part III of the above-mentioned regulations, is cancelled, and the following paragraph is

substituted therefor, viz.:

"(d) In the case of cholera and enteric fever, fresh fruit and vegetables and any other food which, in the opinion of the Quarantine Medical Officer, might have been contaminated by the above-mentioned diseases, either at the place of origin or at any place through which such articles may have passed in transit."

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated December 20th, from

His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople stating that the following decisions were taken at the meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health, held on the 15th December last:

1. The measures in force against Salonica were raised to medical visit and disinfection, followed by a medical visit in each port touched at during the following five days. A medical visit on departure from Salonica is also im-

2. The measures in force against Tripoli (Barbary) are reduced to simple medical visit.

3. Those in force against Kerassonde and Ordou are suppressed.

4. Arrivals from Bigha are subjected to a medical visit. [This is removed; see telegram dated December 28th.]

5. The following measures have been decided

in connection with the returning pilgrimage:—
Pilgrims returning by land will do three days' quarantine and disinfection in the lazaret of Tebuk.

Pilgrim ships destined for Turkish ports on the Mediterranean or Black Sea, and which have already undergone measures at the lazaret of El Tor, will undergo a medical visit and disinfection in one of the Turkish lazarets.

Those destined for Turkish ports on the Red Sea or Persian Gulf should go to the Camaran lazaret, where they will be subjected to three

days' quarantine and disinfection.

A subsequent Telegram, dated December 30th, from the same source, states that two suspected cases of cholera are reported at Mecca. Pilgrimage is declared to be infected. Ordinary ships coming from Jeddah and Yambo will be subject to five days' quarantine, disinfection and application of rat-destruction

Measures for returning pilgrims are also being reinforced.

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of the said road within the parish of Hooe which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the ninth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and eleven.

- (3) That on and after the date of the confirmation of any bye-laws made by the Local Authority under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the height of chimneys of buildings the Local Act which is cited by reference to its short title in the first column of Part I of the Second Schedule to that Order shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that part, be no longer in force in the said district.
- (4) That on and after the 6th day of February, 1911, the Local Acts which are cited by reference to their short titles in the first column of Part II of the Second Schedule to that Order, shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that part, be no longer in 'force in the said district.

PART I.

Closing of Ports.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that local or other circumstances may arise in which it may be necessary, on account of periodical exercises, manœuvres, or otherwise, to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (2), Part II, of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (2), Part II, of this

Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this Notice, search lights are occasionally exhibited for

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search lights are observed to be working.

PART II.

Examination Service.

(1) Under certain circumstances it may become necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this Notice.

(2) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (4) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor.

(3) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in


approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (4), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed

by her or warned by the firing of a gun.

(4) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a

blue border) and a blue ensign.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show

an unbroken light around the horizon.

(5) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions as to entry given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(6) In case of fog, Masters of vessels are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached

with caution.

(7) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.
