CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.
COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty for the purpose will meet at the Council Office, Whitehall, on Friday, the 27th day of January next, at eleven o'clock of the forenoon, to hear and

determine Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July last), and of fees to be received for the same.

The Commissioners at their meeting held on the 16th day of December last resolved as follows:—

- 1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.
- Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned.
- Petitioners may appear by Counsel, Solicitors, or Agents.
- 4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.
- 5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation

by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the list.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such Claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 16th January, from His Majesty's Minister at The Hague, stating that by a Decree of the 12th January the Netherlands Minister of the Interior has withdrawn his Decree, dated the 31st December, by which Salonika was declared to be infected with Asiatic cholera, and also that by a Decree dated the 13th January the Ministers of the Interior and of Finance have withdrawn the prohibition relative to the importation and transit of rags, etc., from the said place.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated November 28th, from His Majesty's Representative at Lima, forwarding the following translation of a Presidential Decree empowering the Sanitary Authorities to make healthy persons arriving from places in which cholera exists undergo observation:—

Lima, November 25, 1910.

Taking into consideration:

That experience has shown the possibility of the transmission of cholera from one country to another by persons carrying the bacillus or even by healthy persons who, however, have germs of that malady in their organism: In conformity with the report of the De-

In conformity with the report of the Department of Public Health and with the decision of the Superior Council of Hygiene;

Be it resolved:

To amplify the existing sanitary regulation in the sense that the sanitary authorities shall

have the power to subject healthy persons, but who are arriving from places in which cholera exists, before allowing them free pratique, to observation, the length of which shall vary in each case between five and forty-five days, according to the result of the bacteriological examination undertaken by the said authorities, until it is shown that virulent bacilli of cholera are absent from their dejections.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

County of MIDDLESEX.

Urban District of Twickenham.

To the County Council of Middlesex;—.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as 'the Act''), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall, not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Middle-sex, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads within the Urban District of Twickenham, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the said Urban District which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
