HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria. chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventeenth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Hornsey, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a district chapelry) of Saint George, Hornsey, which said last named benefice is situate in the said county of Middlesex and in

the said diocese of London.
"Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, is the patron in right of his See of the said bene-

fice of Hornsey, and also of the said benefice of Saint George, Hornsey.

"And whereas the present endowments of the said benefice of Hornsey comprise amongst other things the sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence India three pounds per centum per annum Stock held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the rector or incumbent of the said benefice of Hornsey, and as part of the endowments of the same benefice.

"And whereas it has been made to appear

to us that the said benefice of Saint George,

Hornsey, is at present insufficiently endowed, and that after the transfer to or for the benefit of the incumbent of the said benefice of Saint George, Hornsey, of the said sum of India three pounds per centum per annum Stock the said benefice of Hornsey will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the district chapelry of Saint George, Hornsey, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Hornsey which is hereinafter

recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Hornsey is now full of a clerk, the rector or incumbent thereof being the Reverend Francis Norman Thicknesse, clerk in Holy Orders, who is wil!ing that the said apportionment shall be made accordingly, and has executed this scheme in

token of such his willingness.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two benefices is situate, and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diocese of London, acting as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid, and also with the consent of the said Francis Norman Thicknesse, acting as rector or incumbent of the said benefice of Hornsey, in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this scheme (the Archbishop and the Bishop sealing the same with their several episcopal seals) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme is published in the London Gazette, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any such duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, the said sum of three thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence India three pounds per centum per annum Stock shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Hornsey, and shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the incumbent of said benefice of Saint George, Hornsey, and as part of the endowments of that benefice.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any >

other Act of Parliament.'
