within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Gertain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby:—

All Birds protected on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday within certain Areas.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Derby, except in the boroughs of Chesterfield, Glossop and Ilkeston.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds, also the Eggs of the Birds added by Clause III of this Order to the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881 (except the Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee-Eater, Bittern, Little Bittern, Cornish Chough, Corn Crake (Landrail), Cuckoo, Curlew, Black-throated Diver, Red-throated Diver, Dotterel, Eider Duck, Pintail Duck, Shoveller Duck, Tufted Duck, Dunlin (Ox-bird, Ploverspage, Parre or Sea-Lark), Fulmar, Gadwall, Godwit, Goldfinch, Solan Goose (Gannet), Grey Lag Goose, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock), Gull or Seamew (except Blackbacked Gull), Hawfinch, Common Heron, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Loon, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night Hawk, Fern Owl, Goat Sucker), Golden Oriole, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover (except Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), Pochard or Dunbird, Puffin (Coulternet or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Redshank, Roller, Ruff, or Reeve, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew or Thick-knee, Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Swift, Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species), Wryneck, and (after April 15th in each year) Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 20th July, 1904, is hereby repealed.
