(b) Factories and workshops or parts thereof in which the making of files is carried on;

- (c) Factories and workshops or parts thereof in which the manufacture of toy balloons, pouches, and footballs from india-rubber is carried on;
- (d) Factories and workshops which are laundries;
- (e) Factories and workshops or parts thereof in which the making of iron safes is carried on.
