

enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Felix Milburn Blakiston did with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, as such Bishop and also as such patron as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the minister (so soon as a minister shall have been licensed) of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors and when such district shall have become a new parish then to the vicar or incumbent of such new parish and to his successors one perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to be payable half yearly on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year, a proportionate part of the first of such half yearly payments to be made on such one of those days as shall first happen next after a minister shall have been licensed to the said intended district, free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and the glebe lands, tithes or tithe commutation rent charges, hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments to the said vicarage belonging.

“And whereas the said yearly rent charge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds has been granted as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

“And whereas the said Felix Milburn Blakiston has nominated the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, as the person to whom and to whose successors he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district shall be assigned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of the said parish of Clee, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Stephen, Grimsby.’

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish then of such new parish and of the nomination of an incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to

time be exercised by the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of Saint Stephen, Grimsby, comprising:—

“I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, which is bounded upon the south-west by the new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, upon the south by the parish of Clee, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Aidan, New Cleethorpes, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Aidan, New Cleethorpes, from the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, at the junction of Park-street with Tunnard-street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Tunnard-street for a distance of twenty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Weelsby-street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Weelsby-street for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Eleanor-street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Eleanor-street for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries Eleanor-street over the Weelsby Drain, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, from the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby.

“II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Clee which is bounded upon the north by the above described portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, upon the north-west and upon the south-west by the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, from the said parish of Clee, at the centre of the culvert which carries Welholme-road across the Weelsby Drain, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Welholme-road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the point where such road crosses the middle of the Humberstone Drain, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Carr-lane where the boundary of the municipal borough of Great Grimsby diverges eastward from Carr-lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Carr-lane (thereby following the said municipal borough boundary) for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the point near its junction with Durban-road and Wellington-street, where the boundaries of the said parish of Clee, of the said new parish of Saint Aidan, New Clee-
