third quarters the arms of Cameron, such surname and arms in like manner to be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect;

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Newport) Order, 1910.

Dated 8th March, 1911.

. In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Newport, I hereby make the following Order:-

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Newport) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, so far as concerns the County Borough of Newport, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Newport to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Osprey, Shrikes, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit or Reed Pheasant), Wryneck (Reedling (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds Protected during the Whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough

of Newport:

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow, Dunnock), Bittern, Blackbird, Buntings, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiff Chaff, Goot, Corn Crake (Landrail), Cuckoo, Falcons, Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Greenfinch, Gulls, Haw-Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Greenfinch, Gulls, Hawfinch, Herons, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher,
Kite, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover),
Larks, Linnets, Magpie, Martins, Merlin,
Moorhen, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch,
Osprey, Owls, Pipits, Redpoles, Redstart,
Robin (or Redbreast), Shrikes, Siskin, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Wild Swan, Swift,
Thrushes, Tits, Wagtails, Warblers, Wheatear,
Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat,

Woodpeckers, Wrens, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds Protected on Sundays, Christmas Day and Bank Holidays.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Bank Holidays is prohibited within the County Borough of Newport.

All Birds Protected in Certain Areas.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited in and upon those parts of the County Borough of Newport known as Beechwood Park, Belle Vue Park, Shaftesbury Park and the Cemetery, and also in, upon and above those parts of the rivers Usk and Ebbw and the banks thereof, which are included within the boundary of the said County Borough of Newport, which areas are shown in green on a map deposited with the Town Clerk, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 8th March, 1911.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs_protected throughout the County Borough of Newport.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Wild Birds named in Clause IV of this Order is prohibited within the County Borough of Newport.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of all Wild Birds is prohibited in and upon the said pieces of land known as Beechwood Park, Belle Vue Park, Shaftesbury Park, and the Cemetery, within the said County Borough of Newport, which areas are shown in green on the map referred to in Clause VI of this Order.
