## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

In pursuance of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the date of this Notice, to make an Order under section 36 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, allowing, subject to conditions, the period of employment for women and young persons to begin at 9 a.m. and end at 9 p.m. in factories and workshops
