FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, pursuant to section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the process of applying dry metallic powders to, or dusting them off from, surfaces previously printed or otherwise prepared, in—

Letterpress Printing; or
Lithographic Printing; or
Coating of Metal Sheets;

to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations to apply to all factories and workshops in which such process is carried on.
