

Governor to the Archduke Charles, whose Household will be established about that time. On the 15th instant Died here the Marquis de Fleurus, the Emperors Admiral on the Danube; and it is said that the Sieur d'Assenberg, a Hollander, is to succeed him in that Command; The Gallies and Barks, which were found very useful the last year in covering the Sultans Boats that arrived to an Provision for the Subsistence of the Army, are retiring for the Service of the next Campaign. No body is yet appointed for the General Command in Hungary in the place of Prince Lewis; The Count d'Alcibius Commands at present Ten Imperial Regiments who are quartered between the Drave and the Save.

Stockholm, Feb. 26. This day the Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of Hannover, Elector of Brunswick Lunenburg, had an Audience of the King of Sweden, to which he was Conducted, with the Ceremonies usually practised at the Audiences of Ministers from the Princes Electors of the Empire.

Cologne, Feb. 27. They write from Franckfort, That Prince Lewis of Baden is shortly expected in that City, where in the mean time 300000 Crowns lye ready for him, in Money, Bills of Exchange, and Assignations, for the use of the Imperial Forces that are to Act under his Command; That the Imperial Commissaries continue to Buy up great quantities of Corn, and other Provisions, for the Magazines which they have Orderd to Establish at Franckfort, Hyltberg, and other Places; And that the Elector of Saxony will send 12000 Men to serve on the Upper Rhine this Campaign.

Hannover, Feb. 27. They write from Lemberg in Poland, That some of the Troops of that Crown had detected a Convoy that was going to Constantine, and had taken 200 Wagons laden with Provisions for the use of that Garison.

Paris, Feb. 27. The French King's Journey to Chantilly remains fixt for the 5th of the next Month, and his stay there will be 4 or 5 days, during which, several Reviews will be made of the Troops of the Household. The Prince Royal of Denmark parted from hence on Sunday last; and the day following the French King sent a Gentleman after him, to present him with a Sword set with Diamonds to the value, as is said of above 4000 Pistoles. We hear that Orders are sent to the several Provinces of this Kingdom for raising the Armee ban, and putting them into a readiness to march to such Places as shall be hereafter directed.

Brussels, March 1. The Prince de Courmouy, who had passed the Winter at this Court, parted from hence on Thursday last for Picomont, being one of the Generals that Command the Emperors Forces now in Italy. The same Evening returned hither Lieutenant General du Puy with the Detachment of Horse with which he had been to march to Ghent. The last Letters from Paris say, That the Marquis de Basseville parted from thence on the 21st of the last Month, and there is a report that he is come to Avoy. The Enemy have lately sent two Convoys from Luxembourg to Namur; and we hear that they have likewise transported to this last Place, and to Dinant, all the Ammunition which they had laid up at Mabuzee; This added, That the Count de Guiscard, Governor of Namur, has Summoned in all the Wagons of that Province, to fetch Pistoles and Pistill-dices. Three Regiments of Dragoons are raising in these Counties for the Service of the States General of the United Provinces, in which are employed most of the Spanish Officers of Horse who were lately Retired.

Hague, March 3. The Deputies of the Admiralties are gone home again, but will return hither against the re-opening of the States of Holland, which will be on the 11th instant. The Danish Minister here has presented another Memorial about two Ships lately bought in by the Dutch Capers.

Deal, Feb. 25. Yesterday Sailed out of the Downs to the Westward Their Majesties Ships the Hope, Kent, Hampton-Court, Assistance, and Soldadoes, with 3 Fireships.

Whitehall, Feb. 25. The Baron de Rock, Minister of State, and Envoy Extraordinary of the Elector of Brunswick Lunenburg, had this day Audience of Their Majesties to Notify his E. H. Promotion to the Electoral Dignity; To which Audiences he was Conducted by Sir Charles Cotterell with the Ceremonies usual on the like Occasions.

Whitehall, Feb. 26. This day Monsieur de Bostel, Syndic and Envoy of the City of Hambourg, had Audience of the King and Queen, being Conducted by Sir Charles Cotterell Minister of the Ceremonies in the usual manner.
