Explosives Act, 1875 (38 Vict., c. 17).

Whereas in pursuance of the Explosives Act, 1875 (in this Order referred to as the Act), an Order of the Secretary of State (known as Order of Secretary of State No. 7) was made on the 10th day of June, 1904, adapting the General Rules relating to the packing of gunpowder, contained in Part I of

the Act, to the packing of explosives other than gunpowder; and whereas by section 83 of the Act it is provided that a Secretary of State may by Order from time to time revoke, add to, or alter any previous Orders of the Secretary of State:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers aforesaid, I, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby order as follows:—

Notwithstanding anything in General Rule 5:—

(a) the amount of Cordite or other propellant adopted by the War Department in any one outer or inner package respectively may be One hundred and twenty (120) pounds.

(b) the method of packing and the amount in any one outer or inner package respectively of an explosive of Class IV shall be as follows:—

Class IV, Division 1.	As for Class III, Division 1, other than propellants.	50 lbs.	5 lbs.
Class IV, Division 2.	As for Class I ...	50 lbs.	50 lbs.

PRISONS (ENGLAND AND WALES).

Rules made by the Secretary of State under section 2 (1) of the Prison Act, 1898, with respect to the Period of Separate Confinement of Persons Sentenced to Penal Servitude.

1. The period of separate confinement which convicts will undergo at the beginning of their sentences shall not be prolonged for prisoners classed as "Stars" and "Intermediates" beyond one month, nor for "Recidivists" beyond three months, except in special cases of disciplinary or administrative necessity.

In such cases, or where a convict may himself prefer separate confinement to association on Public Works, a further period may, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, be permitted, not exceeding three months, provided always that any period of separate confinement may be at once terminated or reduced upon medical advice having regard to the convicts' physical or mental condition.

2. The Rule numbered '8 (a) and (b) made by the Secretary of State on the 21st January, 1905, is hereby revoked.
