TEMPORARY ORDER: Relief to Ablebodied Men, their Wives and Families.

BOLTON UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bolton Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Bolton Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Bolton Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the workhouse, shall not be absent from the workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for
