The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Messrs. Charles Stuart Hall and George Marshall Middleton Ræ to superintend the transfer of lascars or other persons, at Glasgow, and Mr. James Yeoman Mosey to superintend the transfer of lascars or other persons at Tilbury Docks, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vict., cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for is limited to three shillings, and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

ALTERING GENERAL CONSOLIDATED ORDER: Appointment of Nurses.

BURNLEY UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Burnley Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the Burnley Union (amongst others), the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Regulations for the government of the Workhouse of that Union;

And whereas by Article 153 of the said Order provision was made for the appointment by the said Guardians of persons to hold certain offices in the said Workhouse, including the office of Nurse, and by Articles 155 and 172 of that Order it was further directed that every such appointment should be reported to the Poor Law Commissioners, and that the Guardians should pay to the officers so appointed such salaries or remuneration as the said Commissioners might from time to time direct or approve;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made with regard to the appointment of persons to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse:

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Direct that, notwithstanding anything contained in the above-cited Order, if the Guardians of the Poor of the said Union shall submit to Us for Our approval a statement showing the total number of persons which the said Guardians consider it necessary to appoint to hold the office of Nurse at the said Workhouse, and the salaries or scale of salaries to be assigned to those Nurses, and We approve that statement, it shall not be necessary for the said Guardians to report to Us each appointment under the said Order of a person to hold the office of Nurse in the said Workhouse, nor to obtain

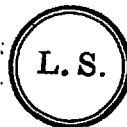
Our approval to the remuneration of any person so appointed, so long as the number of persons so appointed and their salaries do not exceed the number of persons and the scale of salaries shown in the said statement and approved by Us:

Provided as follows:—

(1) This Order shall not apply to the appointment of any Superintendent Nurse appointed subject to the provisions of the Nursing in Workhouses Order, 1897.

(2) A person who has not reached the age of twenty-one years shall not be employed in the capacity of Probationary Nurse.

FURTHER EXTENDING TEMPORARY ORDER: Relief to able-bodied Men, their Wives and Families.

SOUTHWARK UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Southwark Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Saint Saviour's Union (now known as the Southwark Union), the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of October, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1909"), We, the Local Government Board, made temporary provision with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union; and by virtue of a further Order dated the 22nd day of April, 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1910"), the provisions of the Order of 1909 were continued in operation until the 30th day of April, 1911;

And whereas it is expedient that such further provision as is hereinafter set forth should be made in relation to the subject-matter of the Order of 1909:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything in the Order of 1909 or in the Order of 1910, the provisions of the Order of 1909 shall operate and shall have effect until the Thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eleven.
