

in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of March, in the year one thousand nine hundred and three, and published in the London Gazette on the thirty-first day of the same month, a separate district for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the parish of Tooting Graveney, in the said county of Surrey and at that time in the diocese of Rochester, but now in the said diocese of Southwark, and the said district was named 'The District of All Saints, Tooting.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Upper Tooting and the said district of All Saints, Tooting, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Upper Tooting and of the said new parish of All Saints, Tooting, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Upper Tooting and of the said new parish of All Saints, Tooting, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Upper Tooting, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of All Saints, Tooting.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Upper Tooting, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark, and to be annexed to the new parish of All Saints, Tooting, in the same county and diocese, being:—All that portion of the said new parish of Upper Tooting which is bounded upon the south and upon the south-east by the said new parish of All Saints, Tooting, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the boundary stone upon the south-western side of Tooting Bec Road, where the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Tooting, from the said new parish of Upper Tooting turns south-eastward along the south-western side of Tooting

Bec Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to the middle of the said road and then north-westward along the middle of such road for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Tooting Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Upper Tooting Road for a distance of thirty-two chains and fifty links precisely, and extending thence south-eastward across Upper Tooting Road to a point on its south-eastern side upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Upper Tooting from the said new parish of All Saints, Tooting."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the sixth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint James, Birch in Rusholme, the new parish of Saint John, Longsight, and the new parish of Saint Chrysostom, Victoria Park, Manchester; all within the original limits of the parish of Man-
