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Pennennis, August 21.

Several small vessels are lately put in here from the *Iles de Wight* and other places, all of them outwards bound. On Wednesday came in the *Rebeck*, which after a day or two spent in the mouth of the Harbor, set sail for Ireland with a fair wind.

Farmouth, Aug. 5. On Sunday last, arrived in this Road the *Concord* of this Town from *Venice*, with a lading of *Brimstone*, *Rice*, and *Amberseeds*, with which she set sail yesterday for *Amsterdam*. Yesterday came in here five ships, and this day two others from *Iceland*, laden with fish, telling us that a Dutch *East India* ship of considerable value, was lately cast away about *Fars* here came in also one ship laden with *Silk* from *Rochelle*; a Flyboat of *Liege* being also in view with the same lading, and from the same place.

Hamburg, Aug. 25. Letters of the 24th instant from *Warsaw* inform us that in the most part of the inferior and preparatory Diets in the several Provinces of *Poland*, they have resolved to petition that King to change his resolutions, and to continue the Government for a longer time; which if refused, they intend to proceed instantly to an Election: they tell us that the party for the election of the young Prince of *Moskovy* seems to have the greatest probability being daily raised of the great promises which were said to have been made by the *Czary* which election is like also to meet with strong opposition from *Germany*, *Sweden* and *Brandenburg*.

The rumour of the success of the *Moskovites* in *Ukraine* has begun to vanish, especially since *Dorogensko* the General of the *Rebel* *Cossacks*, has but lately offered the Court of *Russia* to restore them out of that Province; *Sabomirski* their general is gone post for *Poland* to be present at the *General* Diet, which the *Emperour* is also sending his Deputy.

From *Stockholm* we are advised, that the Treaty of the League between the *Emperour* and that *Crown* is signed, with some alterations relating to the City of *Bremen* that by this Treaty, the *Emperour* is obliged to pay to the *Swedes* the summe of *150 thousand Rixdollars* yearly, but to reserve his Title and pretensions to that City.

From *Ratisbonne* we are told by Letters of the 5th instant, that the *Directors* of the Circle of *Burgundy* are earnestly desiring the *States* of the *Empire*, to take upon them the protection of *Burgundy*, they having upon all occasions, especially in the wars against the *Turks* largely contributed to the defence of that *Empire*. The Duke of *Fresinghen* Brother to his Electoral Highness of *Cologne*, was the 30th past made Bishop of *Ratisbonne*, and the *Sieur Aramburg* Bishop of *Sohnay* preferred to the Arch-Bishoprick of *Saltsburg*.

The Duke and Dutchess of *Holftein Gotorp*, with several persons of quality are lately arrived at *Copenhagen*, and from thence passed to *Fredericksdal* where the King of *Denmark* intended to treat them with much magnificency. The fortification of *Cronburg* being now upon the ninth of this month is where his found defective, and in the meantime the Officers are putting the other parts of it into execution, and the Captains are filling up their respective Companies, out of such as are lately disbanded to compleat their numbers according to the Regulation.

Brussels, Aug. 10. Several exceptions having been taken at the late Model proposed for the Regulation of our forces, it is taken to mind if where his found defective, and in the meantime the Officers are putting the other parts of it into execution, and the Captains are filling up their respective Companies, out of such as are lately disbanded to compleat their numbers according to the Regulation.

The Marquis de *Castel Rodrigo*, has lately written to the Governours of the several Provinces and Towns under his Government, to give him an exact account what Pensions and Wages His Catholic Majesty has given to them or any of their subordinate Officers: He is this day departed from hence to *Vernez*, intending from thence for *Louvaing* to compole some differences arising about the Election of a *Burgomaster*, which ended, he goes to the Rendezvous appointed for the German forces, consisting of five Regiments of Horse and as many of Foot; between that place and *Wester*.

The Regiment of *Don Antonio Francisco de Aguirre*, which has since the beginning of Winter been quartered in the Suburbs of this City, marched from hence yesterday for *Pandermond*.

The French which were at *Fountain* *Euesque*, are upon their own free motion departed thence, leaving no men the liberty of that place.

The Regiment of Horse commanded by the Baron de *Herbais*, and that of Foot by the Count de *Greengesholt* intended for *Burgundy*, continue still in the Countrey about *Luxembourg*, expecting the Marquis de *Castel Rodrigo* for resolution concerning their pays and Orders for their demeanor upon any accident that may befall them upon their march.

From *Lech* we are informed, that the *Plague* being much spread in that place, obliged the French to draw their Camps out of the Town, where they encamped for some time, but finding that the Infection was also got into their Camps, they were forced to set fire to it, and are since removed to another place.

On Friday last, the Marquis de *Castel Rodrigo* sent away all the Women which attended *Mademoiselle de Appus* his Daughter, leaving only two for her attendance, and on the Sunday following, conducted his Daughter, accompanied by the Count de *de Noyelles* towards *Kalixion* her way to *Hay*, where she was to meet with the Prince de *St. Gregory* her Husband, the Marquis having shewn much dissatisfaction with that Marriage.

On Monday morning last, happened a great fire in the *Fauleon-Cloyster* of *Antwerp*, which consumed above one half of that *Convent*, and might have much endangered a considerable part of the City had it not been timely extinguish.

Many Companies of Horse and Foot are sent away from *Bruges*, with Orders to Quarter about *Nisport*, whither a Billanders are going down with the Baggage belonging to the Marquis de *Castel Rodrigo*, who is now preparing for his departure, having by a Courier arrived yesterday from *Madrid*, been informed that *Don Juan* was departed from *Vigo* to *Coruna*, and might in few days be expected upon our Coasts.

Several French Cavaliers are lately arrived, pretending to have deserted that service, as dissatisfied with their entertainments. Seventeen Spanish Captains, who have been lately reformed, have with much earnestness pressed the Marquis for his leave to return into *Spain*, but are not as yet able to obtain it.

Hague, Aug. 13. The 11th instant in the Evening, arrived here the Bishop of *Besiers* from his Embassy in *Poland*, and was at his landing from his Boat by *Monseur de Ebrades* the French Ambassadors Coach, and conducted to his house, where he intends to continue during his stay abode here, and from hence to pursue his voyage for *Paris*.

The same day arrived here the *Heer Meerman*, one of the States Ambassadors from *England*, and the next day attended the Assembly of the States General, to give them an account of his Negotiation.

The 9th instant, the young Prince of *Denmark*, accompanied by the Count d' *Hoorn*, and several other persons of quality went hence to *Wassenaar*, where they were honorably received and entertained by the *Heer-Vogt Obdam*. The 15th instant, he went away for *Delft* with all his Train, intending the next day to *Maestland-Huyz*, to embark himself for *France*.

An Envoye is some few days since, arrived here from the *Kings of Malitia* to treat with the States about their pretensions to divers Lands and Lordships, which were held by them before the Reformation of those Provinces; and 'tis believed, that (what will be done to put an end to all such claims) and that to their satisfaction.

The Senate of *Genoa* have lately writ a Letter of complement to the States of the *United Provinces*, wherein they tell them, that though they cannot but take notice of some insolencies committed in their Port by Captain *Brakel*, in forcibly taking on some Dutch Seamen, which had lifted themselves under the service of that Senate and Republick, yet they were willing to free him from the imprisonment which he had merited, upon consideration of the Respects they owed to the States General, to which, the States have order'd an answer to be returned in another Letter full of Compliments, and acknowledgements of their moderation.

The States having received informations, that some Fishermen, their Subjects, had lately landed at *Holland*, and committed some disorders amongst the *English*, have given Order to the several Admiralties, to make enquiry after the Offenders, that they may receive exemplary punishment.

Amsterdam Aug. 14: Here is lately arrived one ship, of many others which we have for some time expected from *Greenland*, which lost one of her Masts, and with much difficulty escaped the danger of perishing in the great quantities of Ice she there met with; by her we are informed, that 3 ships were cast away there in the *English Bay* amongst the Ice, viz. 2 belonging to *Hambourg*, 2 to *Staveren*, 2 to *Sardam*, 1 belonging to the *Vly* and one to *Rotterdam*.

The States having taken into their consideration several damages of late received from the Corsairs of *Algier* and *Sally*, have ordered the Admiralties to give in a memorial of what ships have been taken by them, to the end that the *Heer Vander Zaen* who is to command a Squadron to the *Seyghes*, may require full satisfaction of them.

The *East India* Company have resolved upon the following days for the sale of the Commodities brought in by the last Fleet; in this City *Sept. 17*, at *Middleburg*, *Octob. 2*, at *Delft* *Octob. 8* at *Rotterdam* *Octob. 10*, at *Noorn*, *Octob. 12*, and at *Enchusen* *Octob. 17*.

Bruges, Aug. 10: On Saturday last at night arrived at *Osford* three *Fregats* in 26 days from *Vigo* in *Gallicia*, with 700 Spaniards and 50 Bats of silver, to the value of seventy thousand Crowns; there came out with them from *Vigo* the Admiral Royal of *Spain*, with two other great ships which went into *Coruna* to attend the Transportation of *Don Juan*, who expected a farther return of Money promised him from the Court of *Spain*.

The *Plague* is again increased at *Douay*, and spreads itself at *Ghent* and other places. Many *Soldiers* both Horse and Foot are lately marched into the Countrey betwixt *Nieuport* and *Dixmuid*, most of them *German* and *Wal-Ions*; the people both in *Flanders* and *Brabant*, especially near those places appointed for the Encampments and Rendezvous of the several parts of our forces, have made their Complaints to the States of their respective Provinces, declaring that since they were obliged to Quarter the *Soldiers*, they must be excused from paying in the Contribution which was required of them.

The *French* have in *Dunkirk* and *Graveling*, as also in all places of their new Conquests, made an inquiry into the Convents and Religious houses; and have turned out the Guardians and other Officers in the Convents of *Flemish*

Friars, people of ill lives and Conversions, and have placed several *French Friars* in their rooms.

Paris, Aug. 15: By Letters of the 29th of *June* from *Monheur de St. Andre Monbrun*, we are informed, that at his arrival in *Candia*, he found, upon the condition of that place in so good a posture as he expected, neither the number of *Soldiers* within it, nor the fortifications of that place answering the reports made of them, and that the *Turks* had received no small encouragement from a misunderstanding which was risen between the Count de *Maure*, a *French Officer* and General *Spary* a *German*; that since his arrival they had made a lusty assault upon the Town, and had gained the Counterescarp of the main works, but were beaten off again, and chased above 20 paces beyond the *Outworks* with considerable loss, in which Action the Count de *Maure* was killed with a *Musquet* shot between his eyes, as he was taking a view of the enemies *Mines*, and that *S. Junior Cani* is lately dead of his wounds.

The Count de *St. Paul* has upon his Application got leave of his Majesty, to serve the *Venetians* in *Candia* as a *Volunteer*, and intends to begin his journey thither the first of *September*, with several other persons in his company. The Duke de *Roanet* intends to set forwards the 14th instant, having 400 good Officers ready to embark with him for the same service; and has lately desired his Majesty to permit him to serve there under his former name, of *de la Esnuillade*, by which he has been in several services well known amongst the *Turks*.

The King has been for two or three days distemper'd with a *Flux*, for which he was the 13th instant let blood, and is since upon recovery.

'Tis confidently said, His Majesty is resolved to set apart a considerable summe of Moneys to be employed in building of Gallies, to which he intends shall be joyned 15,000 men of War to command the *Mediterranean*.

He has ordered preparations to be made for a new Feast and entertainment for the most considerable persons of his Court before his journey to *Chemberg*, which he has put off till the 15th of *September*, and 'tis said, has some intentions of passing also into *Languedoc* to take a view of the new Channel which is considerably advanced.

The *Marquis de Raigny*, second son to the Duke de *Lein*, *diguites* having a quarrel with the *Chevalier de Mureux*, son to the Governor of the Province of *Beauvois*, their two seconds at *Port-Beauvois* in *Sept.*, where they were both of them killed, with many of the soldiers, killed the *Sieur de Raucour* as a voyard, and the *Sieur de Mureux* in *Portsmouth* *Aug. 6*. Yesterday arrived here *Dox Francisco de Mello*, late Ambassador in *Holland*, in Order of his Embarcation on the *Princesse*, one of his Majesty's men of War, intending for *Lisbon*.

Sir Thomas Allen with his Squadron, conveyed to Spithead; The *Royal-Sovereign* expects only to be put to sea intended for *Chartham*.

London, August 8: The 6th instant arriv'd here *Monseigneur Colbers*, Ambassador from His Most Christian Majesty; where he continues incognito, till his Train and Equipage be prepared for his Publick Entry. And His Majesty has been pleas'd to declare his resolution of sending forthwith *Mr. Mowague* Master of the Horse to the Queen, to reside as his Minister in the Court of *France*, for which he is making his preparations, accordingly.
