MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the
Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within
any limits or place referred to in regulations
made by the Local Government Board with a
view to the safety of the public, on the applica-
tion of the local authority of the area in which
the limits or place are situate, a person shall
not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten
miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of East
Sussex have made application to the Local
Government Board for a regulation to be made
in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the
above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section
in force within the limits comprising the fol-
lowing parts of roads within the Parish of
Crowborough, that is to say:—

So much of Beacon Road as extends in a
westerly direction for a distance of 100 yards
from its junction with the cross roads at the
Red Cross Hotel;

So much of Eridge Road as extends in an
easterly direction for a distance of 100 yards
from its junction with the cross roads afore-
said;

So much of London Road as extends from
its junction with the cross roads aforesaid to
its junction with Pilmer Road;

So much of Station Road as extends from
its junction with the cross roads aforesaid to
its junction with Croft Road at the Broad-
way;

So much of Croft Road as extends in a
northerly direction for a distance of 100
yards and in a southerly direction for a dis-
tance of 100 yards from its junction with
the cross roads known as Powell's Corner;
and

So much of Church Road as extends in an
easterly direction for a distance of 100 yards
and in a westerly direction for a distance of
100 yards from its junction with the cross
roads known as Powell's Corner.

And whereas notice of the said application
and of the time and manner in which objec-
tions should be made to any such regulation
appeared in the London Gazette of the 25th
day of April, 1911, and in the Sussex Daily
News of the 22nd day of April, 1911:
