The Knights Companions and the Officers of the Order then proceeded to the Grand Reception Room and waited there while the Sovereign and Her Majesty the Queen Sovereign and Her Majesty the Queen [attended by four Pages, H. D. Erskine, Esquire, of Cardross, C.V.O., Gentleman Usher of the Pakes and M. D. Usher of the Robes, and the Duchess of Devonshire, Mistress of the Robes], His Majesty King Manuel, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, and His Royal Highness Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, passed to the Throne Room.

The Sovereign being seated in His Chair of State, Her Majesty the Queen being on His immediate left hand, His Majesty King Manuel, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, and His Royal Highness Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein being in the seats allotted to them at the upper end of the Table, the Sovereign commanded Garter to summon the Knights Companions, who entered the Throne Room as their names were severally called over.

The Knights Companions then took their respective seats at the Table. The Prelate passed up the room, and took his stand on the right of the Sovereign, the Chancellor passing to his place on the left of Her Majesty the Queen, and the Register, Garter, Black Rod and Secretary standing at the foot of the Table.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales was then, by the Sovereign's command, conducted from his apartments to the Throne Room, between Their Royal Highnesses the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn and Prince Arthur of Connaught, preceded by the Secretary, carrying the Star and Collar of the Order, Black Rod, carrying the Riband and George,

and Garter, carrying the Garter.
On entering the Throne Room His Royal

by the Prelate.

Black Rod next presented in like manner the Riband and George to the Sovereign, who, assisted as before, adjusted the same on the left shoulder of His Royal Highness, the Admonition being pronounced by the Chancellor.

The Secretary, then presented in like manner the Star of the Order which the Sovereign affixed to His Royal Highness' left breast.

The Secretary in like manner presented the Collar, which was handed by the Sovereign to His Royal Highness, the Admonition being

pronounced by the Register.

The Sovereign thereupon gave the Accolade to His Royal Highness, who proceeded round the table, receiving the congratulations of Her Majesty the Queen, His Majesty King Manuel, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, His Royal Highness Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, and each of the Knights Companions present, and resumed his seat.

The Chapter being ended, the Knights Companions were again severally called over by Garter, and, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign with the usual ceremonies.
