Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cumberland:—

Turtle Dove, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Owl (all

species).

Certain Birds protected on Sundays and on Christmas Day.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cumberland:—

Brambling, Bullfinch, Lapland Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Chaffinch, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Shore Lark, Sky Lark, Linnet, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Twite, Wren, Goldencrested Wren.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is pro-libited throughout the Administrative County of Cumberland:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Cornic Crake (or Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Cuckoo, Curlew, Dipper, Dotterel, Turtle Dove, Dunlin, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Little Grebe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Linnet, Mallard or Wild Duck, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar, Ring Ouzel, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Tree Pipit, Rock Pipit, Golden Plover, Ringed Plover, Quail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Sandpiper, Shoveller, Skylark, Snipe, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Terns, Coal Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpeckers, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.
