The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 21st June, from His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at St. Petersburg, stating that a case of cholera is reported to have occurred at Odessa, and that all necessary measures have been taken.

It is also stated that the Commission for the adoption of preventive measures against plague and cholera has issued an order, dated the 17th June, establishing a medical observation station at Windau for all vessels bound for Russian ports in the Baltic having cholera aboard or having sailed from plague-infected ports. In the case of such vessels being bound for St. Petersburg and Cronstadt a similar medical observation station has been opened for the navigation season at Cronstadt.
